# NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER GRANTING CERTIFICATE

#### BY THE COUNTSSION:

Notice is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for formal proceeding pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Jones Lightwave of Tampa, Inc. filed an application for an interexchange certificate on January 28, 1991. The application contained the required background information and its proposed The Company is a non-facilities based company which initially plans to lease dark fiber transmission capacity from certain carrier's carriers. It will then lease this capacity to other certificated telecommunications carriers. After having considered the application, it appears that the Company is technically capable of providing service. Therefore, we find that it is in the public interest to grant a certificate to Jones Lightwave of Tampa, Inc., and it is our intention to grant the Interexchange carriers (IXCs) are subject to the Rules 25-24.455 through 25-24.495, Florida certificate. provisions of Rules Administrative Code. Additionally, by Order No. 16804, IXCs are prohibited from constructing facilities to bypass a local exchange company without express prior approval from the Commission.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
