MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Comes now GTE Florida Incorporated (GTEFL or Company), pursuant to the provisions of Commission Rule 25-22.037, Fla. Admin. Code, and moves the Commission for an extension of time to comply with the provisions of Order No. 24718 issued on June 26, 1991. In support of its request, GTEFL states as follows:

- 1. Order No. 24718 directs GTEFL to perform certain traffic studies in order to allow the Commission to evaluate and consider a request for countywide EAS filed by the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners. Said Order directs the Company, along with Southern Bell and United Telephone Company, to submit traffic studies by August 26, 1991.
- 2. Order No. 24718 requires the analysis of foreign exchange (FX) lines in service and the average calling volumes transported on these lines in the following manner: (a) messages per month and, (b) in CCS units. The Order also requires the Company to determine, for each route where an FX exists, what a new M/M/M would be on the percent of subscribers making two or more calls if the FX lines were considered as regular point-to-point traffic. Order No. 24718 requires the analysis of interexchange toll traffic based on the

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following criteria: (a) interexchange toll rates, (b) distance between rate centers, (c) the number and duration of calls by time of day and, (d) the average revenue per message (ARPM) for the calls studied.

- 3. Accordingly, Order No. 24718 ultimately requires an analysis of FX usage data on a per-call and time-of-day basis. GTEFL does not have readily available FX usage data and call data by time of day. Therefore, the Company seeks an additional 30 days in which to compile this information.
- GTEFL submits that no party will be prejudiced or harmed by this extension of time.

WHEREFORE, GTE Florida Incorporated moves the Florida Public Service Commission to enter its Order extending the time in which to submit the traffic study from August 26, 1991 through and including September 26, 1991.
