## SOUTHERN BELL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR SPECIFIED CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

COMES NOW BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a/ Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Southern Bell" or "Company"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, and files its Request for Specified Confidential Classification for certain information included in Southern Bell's Traffic Studies filed in the above-referenced docket.

1. On February 3, 1992, the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") issued Order No. 25675 which required Southern Bell to file certain traffic studies. In response to the Commission's Order, Southern Bell is filing the traffic studies on routes that contain interLATA interexchange carrier ("IXC") traffic information which is proprietary confidential business information and intraLATA traffic information which Southern Bell considers proprietary confidential business information because of intraLATA competition in Florida. <u>See</u>, Order No. 20051 and Order No. 22983. The information that Southern Bell considers proprietary has been highlighted for identification purposes and appended hereto as Attachment "A".

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The information contains AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc.'s ("AT&T") interLATA traffic data regarding toll routes in Volusia County received from AT&T pursuant to a nondisclosure agreement. In accord with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Southern Bell has appended hereto as Attachment "B" two edited copies of the traffic studies with this confidential information removed.

Commission Rule 25-22.006(4)(a) provides that a utility 2. may satisfy its burden of proving that information is specified confidential material by demonstrating how the information falls under one or more of the available statutory examples. In the alternative, if no statutory example is available, the utility may satisfy its burden by including a justifying statement indicating what penalties or ill effects on Southern Bell or its ratepayers will result from the disclosure of the information to the public. Southern Bell is requesting that the Commission treat interLATA IXC traffic information and Southern Bell intraLATA traffic information described above as confidential. Southern Bell is identifying this confidential information on a line-by-line basis and is appending such line-by-line identification hereto as Attachment "C".

3. The traffic data relative to the interLATA and intraLATA routes at issue in this proceeding basically provide a blueprint of the toll usage over these various routes. The information contained in these traffic studies was obtained from AT&T with the express understanding that such information was

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proprietary confidential business information and as such should be protected from public disclosure in these proceedings. Southern Bell maintains its own intraLATA traffic information on a confidential and proprietary basis. The information is used by Southern Bell in order that Southern Bell may accurately plan its network deployment based on actual and perceived traffic demand over the respective toll routes.

Although the traffic information is clearly necessary 4. for a full examination of the merits of the extended area service request in this case, such information also contains data that indicates which routes at issue in this case contain the most concentrated traffic. The disclosure of such traffic patterns to the public would make available to Southern Bell and AT&T's competitors highly valuable competitive information which such competitors could use to target the most lucrative routes. Τf the Commission were to publicly release the interLATA traffic data Southern Bell has obtained from AT&T, not only would such public release competitively harm AT&T directly, but it also would almost certainly harm Southern Bell because AT&T could hereafter withhold such information from Southern Bell due to the threat of public release of such information. Of course, without accurate traffic data from the interexchange carriers, Southern Bell would be severely hampered in its efforts to plan its network deployment, particularly with regard to situations where expansion may be needed.

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5. The information for which confidential treatment is requested has not been disclosed except pursuant to a protective agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public.

6. For all the foregoing reasons, Southern Bell respectfully urges the Commission to classify the above-described and discussed interLATA and intraLATA traffic data as proprietary confidential business information pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, and as such exempt from Section 119.07, Florida Statutes.

WHEREFORE, Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company moved the Commission to enter his Order declaring this information to fall within the specified confidential classification.

# ATTACHMENT "C" DOCKET NO. 911185-TL ORDER NO. 25675

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- REASON 1: These traffic data relate to toll usage over the various routes at issue. This information was obtained from AT&T with the express understanding that it is proprietary confidential business information that would be protected from public disclosure in these proceedings. The information identifies the routes at issue in this case that contain the greatest concentration of traffic. The disclosure of this information to the public would allow the competitors of AT&T and Southern Bell to target the most lucrative routes and would thereby competitively harm both companies.
- REASON 2: These traffic data relate to toll usage over the various routes at issue. This is proprietary information maintained by Southern Bell on a confidential basis to plan its network deployment based on traffic demand over the respective toll routes. The disclosure of this information would allow Southern Bell's competitors in the intraLATA toll market to target the most lucrative routes and would thereby competitively harm Southern Bell.
