ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED AT RULEMAKING HEARING

I. Background

The Florida Public Service Commission has proposed new and revised rules relating to the regulation of water and wastewater utilities. The proposed new rules, rule amendments and repeal were published in the Florida Administrative Weekly on April 2, 1993.

II. Rulemaking Hearing

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III. Hearing Procedures

The following procedures shall apply:

- 1. The Commission staff will present a summary of the economic impact statement and the rules.
- 2. Following the staff presentation, affected persons will have the opportunity to make presentations. Participants should limit their presentations to 20 minutes. Persons with similar positions should combine to make one presentation.
- At the conclusion of each presentation, if time permits, participants will have the opportunity to ask questions of the presenters.
- 4. Testimony and comments should be prefiled, by filing an original and 15 copies by May 17, 1993. The comments already filed and any additional comments and testimony filed by that date will be incorporated in the indexed set for the Commission; however, no additional comments are required. At a minimum, all persons who wish to participate at the hearing should file a list of the rules that the participant will not be commenting on.
- 5. Persons who wish to participate at the hearing must register at the beginning of the hearing. The general order of presentation will be as follows:
