ORDER APPROVING TARIFF FILING

BY THE COMMISSION:

On January 31, 1994 GTEFL filed a tariff to introduce two additional methods of accessing its Packet Switching Network Service. The two proposed methods are Public Dial Access and Dedicated Access. Public Dial Access allows a customer with a public switched telephone line and a modem to dial a public switched telephone number which is terminated on GTEFL's packet switch. Dedicated Access allows a customer to subscribe to an analog or digital private line which connects the customer's data terminal equipment to GTEFL's packet switch.

Upon review, we shall approve GTEFL's tariff filing to introduce Public Dial Access and Dedicated Access as additional methods of accessing the Company's Packet Switching Network Service. The proposed rates appear to cover the estimated costs of the offering. The service will provide greater access to, and use of, the Company's Packet Switch Network which should increase network efficiency.

Therefore, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that GTEFL's tariff filing to add Public Dial Access and Dedicated Access as two additional methods of accessing Local Packet Switching Network Service is hereby approved. It is further

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The Commission's decision on this tariff is interim in nature and will become final, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed files a petition for a formal 25-22.036(4), Florida proceeding, as provided by Rule form provided by Rule Code, in the Administrative 25-22.036(7)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on April 18, 1994.

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In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final on the day subsequent to the above date.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this Order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this Order becomes final on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the date this Order becomes final, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
