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ALLTEL FLORIDA, INC.'S MOTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PETITIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION OF ORDER NO. PSC-94-0285-FOF-TP

ALLTEL Florida, Inc. ("ALLTEL"), by and through its undersigned counsel, files this Motion for Reconsideration and says:

1. On March 10, 1994, the Florida Public Service Commission ("FPSC" or the "Commission") issued Order No. PSC-94-0285-FOF-TP ("Phase I Order"). This order memorialized the Commission's decisions on the issues in Phase I of this docket.

As it relates to non-Tier I LECs like ALLTEL, the Phase
I Order states:

Upon review, only the Tier I LECs shall be required to offer expanded interconnection as a tariff to generally available service. We also find it appropriate to allow non-Tier I LECs to negotiate provisions of the service in response to bona fide requests. If the terms and conditions of such request cannot be reached, the Commission will review the matter on a case-by-case basis.

Phase I Order at 18 (emphasis added).

3. Since the Phase I Order was issued, the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit issued its opinion in <u>Bell Atlantic Telephone Company v. Federal</u> <u>Communications Commission</u>, 1994 W.L. 247134 (DC Cir. June 10,

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1994). As a result of this order, the Commission has given the parties an opportunity to address the Phase I Order.

4. In light of the <u>Bell Atlantic</u> decision, the Commission should reconsider the Phase I Order as it relates to non-Tier I LECs. As noted in Southern Bell's Notice of Supplemental Authority and Motion for Additional Briefing, filed June 29, 1994, the <u>Bell</u> <u>Atlantic</u> decision clearly implies that the Phase I Order is unlawful insofar as it requires certain physical collocation.

5. While the Phase I Order does not impose a mandatory physical collocation requirement on non-Tier I LECs, the Phase I Order clearly implies that the Commission believes it has the power to require a non-Tier I LEC to offer physical collocation on terms and conditions approved by the FPSC if the parties are unable to reach an agreement on a negotiated basis.

In light of <u>Bell Atlantic</u>, the FPSC should reconsider its Phase I Order and eliminate all express or implied references to mandatory physical collocation, including the implied threat of mandatory physical collocation as a possible resolution of failed negotiations between non-Tier I LECs and persons making bona fide requests.

WHEREFORE, ALLTEL Florida, Inc. respectfully requests that the Florida Public Service Commission reconsider its Phase I Order consistent with the arguments and discussions contained herein.
