UNITED TELEPHONE COMPANY OF FLORIDA AND CENTRAL TELEPHONE COMPANY OF FLORIDA'S JOINT MEMORANDUM IN OPPOSITION TO IAC'S MOTION FOR PARTIAL RECONSIDERATION

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.037(2)(b), Florida Administrative Code, United Telephone Company of Florida and Central Telephone Company of Florida (the "Companies") file this Memorandum in Opposition to the Interexchange Access Coalition's ("IAC") Motion for Partial Reconsideration, dated January 24, 1995 ("Motion"), and say:

To prevail on a motion for reconsideration, the moving 1. party must show some point the agency failed to consider or overlooked when it rendered its order. Diamond Cab Co. of Miami v. King, 145 So.2d 889, 891 (Fla. 1962). A motion for reconsideration cannot be used to reargue a point because the moving party disagrees with the order. Id.

IAC's Motion should be denied because it fails to show 2. some point the Commission failed to consider or overlooked when it issued its order. Rather, the Motion constitutes an attempt to reargue points previously considered and decided by the Commission.

3. With respect to the DS3-DS1 cross-over ratio, IAC claims that "no evidence supporting lower cross-over ratios was Andreassi, However, Teleport's witness, Mr. submitted." acknowledged in the record that Teleport prices its DS1 and DS3

services such that the DS1 to DS3 crossover is in the range of 3.17 to 7.8<sup>1</sup> DS1 to DS3 cross-over ratios that presently exist in the markets for these services provide evidence which supports lower cross-over ratios than advocated by IAC.

4. IAC also claims that "cross-over ratios of 14-21 are inconsistent with the goals of the final order." Not surprisingly, the Motion fails to consider the full context of the goals expressed in the order. The Order clearly states: "we do not believe that a single criterion is sufficient by itself upon which to set a rate. Rather, all relevant factors should be considered in setting prices for Local Transport rate elements."<sup>2</sup> Similarly, the Order appropriately recognizes that "competitive realities" could lead to non-uniform contribution levels across services.<sup>3</sup>

5. The other points raised in the Motion are merely attempts to reargue points already considered by the Commission.

WHEREFORE, the Companies respectfully request that the FPSC deny IAC's Partial Motion for Reconsideration.
