 ISSUE: What is the final end-of-the-period true-up amount for the period October 1, 1993 through September 30, 1994?

FPC: \$9,528,276 over-recovery

 ISSUE: What is the appropriate conservation cost recovery factors for the period April 1995 through March 1996?

 ISSUE: Are all the utilities participating in the conservation cost recovery clause entitled to recover their advertising expenses incurred during the period October 1993 through September 1994?

FPC: With respect to FPC, yes.

4. <u>ISSUE</u>: Should the Commission open a docket to establish standards for the energy claims made in advertisements and promotional literature related to ECCR? Some of the related variables are energy efficiency, energy consumption, equipment costs, etc.
