NOW COMES AT&T Communications of the Southern States,
Inc. (hereinafter "AT&T") and, pursuant to Rule 25-22.039,
Florida Administrative Code, files the Petition for Leave to
Intervene with the Florida Public Service Commission
(hereinafter the "Commission") in the above-referenced
docket. AT&T respectfully requests that the Commission
grant this petition, designating AT&T a party of record and
affording it all applicable rights under Florida law and the
rules and regulations of this Commission. In support
thereof, AT&T respectfully shows as follows:

- 3. AT&T is an interexchange carrier (hereinafter "IXC"), duly certificated by the Commission to provide interexchange telecommunications service in Florida. As a certificated IXC, AT&T is subject to the rules, regulations, and orders of the Commission, and such rules, regulations, and orders impact AT&T's ability to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications service.
- 4. The above-referenced docket was opened for the purpose of implementing local telephone number portability in Florida in response to recent revisions to Chapter 364, Florida Statutes. As an IXC, AT&T must use the local access services of Local Exchange Telecommunications Companies (hereinafter "LECs") and will potentially use the local access services of Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Companies (hereinafter "ALECs") to reach its customers. The issues in this docket could impact the nature of those services and AT&T's ability to deliver interexchange services to its customers. Consequently, AT&T's substantial interests will be affected by the outcome of this proceeding.

WHEREFORE, AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc. respectfully requests that the Florida Public Service Commission grant its Petition for Leave to Intervene in the above-referenced docket.
