## PETITION

Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "the company") files this its petition for approval of revisions to its service charges tariff which would provide for a late payment charge, and in support thereof says:

1. Tampa Electric is an investor-owned electric utility operating under the jurisdiction of this Commission and serving retail customers in Hillsborough and portions of Polk, Pinellas and Pasco Counties. The company's principal offices are located at 702 North Franklin Street, Tampa, Florida 33602.

3. In this petition, Tampa Electric seeks approval of a late payment charge to be applied to customers' past due balances. The purpose of the late payment charge is to more properly collect the costs associated with unpaid balances on customer accounts from those customers who do not pay their bills on time. In addition, a late payment charge should encourage prompt payment, thereby helping Tampa Electric reduce expenses associated with unpaid
balances. Tampa Electric's present tariff does not include a late payment charge on past due balances.
4. The late payment charge will apply when a customer fails to pay $a$ bill by the past due date indicated on the customer's bill. The proposed late payment charge for customers, except for accounts of federal, state and local governmental entities, is 1.5 percent of any unpaid prior past due billings. The abovereferenced governmental entities are subject to the imposition of a late payment charge in accordance with Section 215.422 , Florida Statutes (state agencies), Section 218.70-.79, Florida Statutes (local governmental agencies), and 31 U.S.C. 3901-3907 (federal governmental agencies). Tampa Electric seeks authority to bill a late charge for past due balances for these governmental agencies at a rate no greater than allowed, and in a manner permitted, by applicable law.
5. In prior dockets, the Commission approved similar late payment charges for other Florida electric utilities. The most recent such approval is reflected in Commission Order No. PSC-95-1087-FOF-EI (Docket No. 95073-EI, In Re: Petition for approval of late payment charge and field collection charge by Florida Power Corporation), and In Re: Tariff Proposed by Floricia Power \& Light Company, Docket No. 900836-EI, Order No. 23895 (December 18, 1990). Consistent with the prior actions of the Commission, and for the reasons hereinabove stated, Tampa Electric requests the Commission's approval for the Company's late payment charge as set forth in the proposed revised tariff sheet (Eighth Revised Sheet

No. 3.030) attached to this petition as Exhibit A. A copy of the proposed revised sheet in legislative format is attached hereto as Exhibit B.
6. Upon the Commission's approval of Tampa Electric's proposed late payment charge, the Company will modify its monthi $\ddot{j}$ customer bills to reflect the applicable charge and the past due date after which the bills are subject to imposition of such charge.
7. Tampa Electric requests that the Commission approve this petition, and grant its Staff authority to administratively approve the effective date of Eighth Revised Sheet No. 3.030 to coincide with the date on which the Company's billing system will be capable of implementing and administering the late payment charge, which date is currently estimated to be May 1, 1996.

WHEREFORE, Tampa Electric respectfully requests that the Commission (a) approve the late payment charge set forth in Exhibit A to this petition and (b) authorize its Staff to administratively approve the effective date of the revised tariff sheet upon proper notification by the Company.

## SERVICE CHARGES

A $\$ 38.00$ service charge will be made for the establishment of each initisl service connection.
A $\$ 35.00$ service charge will be made for each reestablishment of service after such service has been discontinued as provided for in Section 5, Part 2.14 of this Tariff.

A $\$ 16.00$ service charge will be made for all other connections including the changing of an existing customer's account to another customer's name.

An $\$ 8.00$ collection charge will be made when a service representative visits a premises for the purpose of discontinuing service for nonpayment of a delinquent account and does not discontinue service because the customer (1) pays, (2) makes arrangement to pay, or (3) cannot be contacted at the time of the call.

A service charge of $\$ 15$ or $5 \%$ of the amount of the check, whichever is greater, shall be added to the customer's bill for electric service for each check dishonored by the bank upon which it is drawn. Termination of service shall not be made for failure to pay the returned check charge.

Charges for services due and rendered which are unpaid as of the past due date are subject to a Late Payment Charge of $1.5 \%$, except the accounts of federal, state, and local governmental entities, agencies, and instrumentalities. Accounts of federal, state, and local governmental agencies, and instrumentalities are subject to a Late Payment Charge at a rate no greater than allowed, and in manner permitted, by applicable law.

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
