4	surrounding 33 residential communities, we feel this		
5	sufficient community of interest.		
6	Issue 2: What other community of interest factors should be considered in determining if either an optional or nonoptional toll alternative should be implemented on these routes.		
7	Position: Since no calling volume records are available from		
8	any of the telephone companies involved, we have		
9	submitted in our February 19,1996 letter with		
10	testimony & exhibits the exhibit marked Exhibit "A"		
11	which shows, in a short period of time, the pattern		
12	of usage from a small cross section of phone users		
13	the typical usage to the routes in question.
