## CASE BACKGROUND

On June 21, 1996 Indiantown Telephone System, Inc. (Indiantown or the Company) filed a tariff to amend its directory assistance charge for disabled customers. This filing allows disabled customers to have unlimited free local directory assistance calls. Indiantown filed this tariff in order to comply with Order No. PSC-95-1366-FOF-TP, which amended rule 25-4.115, F.A.C. The amendment provided unlimited local directory assistance calls for disabled customers at no charge.

## DISCUSSION OF ISSUES

ISSUE 1: Should the proposed tariff filing to amend Indiantown Telephone System, Inc's. directory assistance charge for disabled customers be approved?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes. The proposed tariff filing to amend Indiantown's directory assistance charge for disabled customers should be approved, with an effective date of July $21,1996$.

DATE: July 7, 1996

STAFF ANALYSIS: Through its tariff filing, Indiantown seeks io amend its directory assistance charge for disabled customers. Currently, the Company charges $\$ .25$ for each call in excess of fifty calls for individuals with disabilities. This filing allows Indiantown to provide disabled customers unlimited local directo:y assistance calls at no charge. Staff believes that this amendment to Indiantown's tariff is in the interest of the disabled citizenn who are served by the Company, and it is in compliance with order No. PSC-95-1366-FOF-TP.

In summary, staff recommends that the Commission approve Indiantown's tariff filing to amend its directory assistance charge to disabled individuals.

ISSUE 2: Should this docket be closed?
RECOMMENDATION: Yes. If issue 1 is approved, this tariff should become effective July 21, 1996. If a protest is filed within 21 days from the issuance date of the Order, the tariff should remain in effect pending resolution of the protest. If no timely protest is filed, this docket should be closed.

If the Commission approves Issue 1 , this tariff should become effective July 21, 1996. If a protest is filed within 21 days from the issuance date of the Order, the tariff should remain in effect pending resolution of the protest. If no timely protest is filed, this docket should be closed.

3.3 DIRECTORX ASSISTANCE SERVICE
3.3.1 GENERAL
a. The company furnishes Directory Assistance Service whereby subscribers may request assistance in determining telephone numbers.
b. The rates set forth below apply when subscribers of the Company request assistance in determining telephone numbers of subscribers (1) who are located in the same local service area, or (2) who are not located in the same local service area but who are located within the State of Florida.
3.3.2 RATES
a. Local Directory Assistance

There is no charge for directory assistance calls for individuals with disabilities. All others widi be charged $\$ .25$ for each Directory Assistance call (411) in axcess of three (3) per access line per billing peried. (Authority: Order No, PSC-95-1366-FOF-TP), A oubsoriber-io-allowed three-(3) Leeal Direetory Aesiotance-allo (411) per-areess-line per billing period at no-charge, exeept-for individualo-with-dioabilities-and-eaoh-oall-in exeess-of-three-3), or in-eweese-gi-fifty ( 50 ) for individuale with dieabilities, wili be charged at- 6.25 .
(1) Call allowances are not transferable between separate accounts of the same subscriber.
(2) A subscriber may obtain a maximum of two (2) telephone numbers per call.
(3) Charges for Local Directory Assistance are not applicable to calls placed from Public and SemiPublic Telephones.

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## 25-4.115 Directory Assistance

(1) Directory assistance service provided by any telephone company shall be subject to the following:
(a) Charges for directory assistance shall be reflected in tariffs filed with the Commission and shall apply to the end-user.
(b) The tariff shall state the number of telephone numbers that may be requested by a customer per directory assistance call.
(2) Charges for calls within a local calling area or within a customer's Home Numbering Plan Area (HNPA) shall be at rates prescribed in the general service tariff of the local exchange company originating the call and shall be subject to the following:
(a) There shall be no charge for directory assistance c $\bar{\varepsilon}$ Us up to fifty eallo per billing eyele from lines or trunks serving individuals with disabilities. As used in this rule subpart and subpart (3) (a) thereof, "disability" means, with respect to an individual - A physical or mental impairment that prohibits a customer from using the telephone directory. The-leeal exehange eariter ohall eharge ito prevailing tariff rateo for every eall in exeese of 50 within a billing eyele-
(b) The same charge shall apply for calls within a local calling area and calls within an HNPA.
(c) The tariff shall state the number of calls per billing month per individual line or trunk to the number designated for local directory assistance (i.e., 411, 311 or 611) for which no
charges will apply. The local exchange company shall charge for each local directory assistance call in excess of this allowance. The charge shall not apply for calls from pay stations. . -
(d) The local exchange company shall apply the charge for each call to the number designated for long distance directory assistance within the customer's HNPA (i.e.. $1+(904$ ) 555-1212).
(3) Charges for intrastate calls to directory assistance outside of the caller's HNPA shall be at rates prescribed in the general :lervices tariff of the interexchange companies and shall be subject to the following:
(a) There shall be no charge for up to fifty calls per billing cycle from lines or trunks serving individuals with disabilities. See subpart (2) (a) of this rule for the definition of "disability". The interexchange carrier shall charge its prevailing tariff rates for every call in excess of 50 within a billing cycle.
