COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Is that it for appearances? And Staff.

MS. BARONE: Monica Barone, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida on behalf of Staff.

commissioner Johnson: Are there any other preliminary matters before I kind of go over the format and the purpose for the status conference calls?

Okay. Hearing nothing, what we've decided to do, and as was reflected in the order, given the magnitude of this case and the need for us to kind of compress our time lines, what we thought would be helpful for all the parties is that we hold these Wednesday morning 8:00 a.m. conference calls unless we notify you otherwise.

What we intend to do in order to facilitate the process is have our Monday before the Wednesday conference call be the deadline for the submission of motions or pleadings. At that point in time Staff will compile that information, meet with me on perhaps Tuesday morning or before midday on Tuesday. We will determine the agenda for the Wednesday conference call.

To the extent that there are no motions or

issues that we need to resolve, you will receive a fax stating that the call will be cancelled for that particular Wednesday. To the extent that there are issues, we will try to give you notice as to what the issues might be, what the objections might be, what the matter might be ahead of time, so that you will be prepared to participate in the Wednesday conference calls.

The number will be the same number as we used today for the next series of weeks. We have allotted this time and this number, I think, well into the fall.

MS. BARONE: August 28th.

commissioner Johnson: August 28th. So if you just keep that in your back pocket, it will be an easy way to just have a consistent and easy process for us to communicate with one another.

Other housekeeping matters: If you could, for the benefit of our Staff attorney, all motions or pleadings that you file here at the Commission, could you bring a copy of those to Monica so that she can process those.

Oftentimes if you just take them to Records and Reporting, that may chew up 24 hours or so before she actually receives the documents. So we are

requesting that you hand deliver copies to our Staff so they can immediately begin their review and so that they can immediately inform me.

Are there any other questions or issues that

we have, Monica?

ws. BARONE: One last thing: There are a couple of people on the phone that I do not have your fax numbers. If everyone on the phone will please contact me with a fax number that you want me to send the agenda to, I'd appreciate that.

My fax number is 413-6198. So send me your name, your fax number and your phone number so we can contact you when we need to.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Are there any questions from any of the parties?

MS. WHITE: Yes. This is Nancy White. I have a question on the motions to be filed on Monday, and I guess I'm thinking really more about objections to discovery.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Sure.

MS. WHITE: We have 10 days to file those objections, and that may not always land on a -- you know, right before a Monday. It might be a Tuesday or Thursday. Is that going to be a problem?

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: We're going to try to

accommodate scheduling, Nancy, and to the extent that there are motions where it falls on a Tuesday before the hearing, if you could contact Monica and let her know when that's going to arrive so that we can at least expect it and try to prepare an agenda in that case, that would be helpful.

And to the extent that there are emergency issues that arise, go ahead and call Staff, and Staff will call me, and we will try to accommodate that, too, to the extent that we can.

A lot of this is trying to eliminate surprise and keep things as organized as we can for the benefit of the parties, but we understand that we won't be able to do that in all cases.

MS. WHITE: Okay.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Any other questions? We weren't sure if there were issues today or not, so we decided we'd at least start the call and let everyone know the procedure that we're going to use.

Right now, with respect to the ports available to actually participate in the calls, I think we have about 30 lines. The way I think we're going to handle that is, certainly the parties and the intervenors, we will ensure when I do the call to make sure that those folks are on the call.

With respect to those people that are filing as interested parties, I wanted to get some reaction from you all as to their involvement in the conference call and how perhaps we should facilitate that process.

I know first and foremost that the parties and the intervenors, we will ensure that there is a port so that they can participate in these calls. With respect to the others, what are your opinions or suggestions on those issues?

I'm just concerned that we get 40 or 50 people wanting to participate or listen in on these calls and what we should do in order to accommodate that. Or are there any objections to people listening in to the calls?

MR. WIGGINS: Commissioner Johnson, this is Pat Wiggins. It's not clear to me that we -- that this is not some sort of public meeting. I've not really thought about prehearing conferences or status conferences in terms of public records in open government, but it seems to me that the best thing to do is to allow anyone who wants to call in, to call in; otherwise, it looks like we're doing business behind closed doors, which doesn't seem to me to be --.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Sure. And we have a limited amount of ports, so once those fill up, to the extent that there's a party, we may have to tell someone to get off the line to allow a party to come in. And the meetings will be recorded, so they could have the benefit of those records.

But currently I guess I would agree with you that to the extent there are lines and lines available if others wanted to listen in, then they have the right to do that.

Any other comments on that?

MR. BUTLER: This is Jim Butler with Excel, and I certainly agree with what Pat just mentioned.

And, also, the fact that we are an interested party -- I certainly don't intend to be an intervenor -- if we had access to the records, in that something comes along to where you don't have the ports available for us to listen, well, I can understand that, and as long as we get a hold of the records, that's all we need.

commissioner Johnson: Okay. And, Jim, we will have everything recorded, and we will of course give you access to whatever occurred at the proceedings. You will have access to the transcripts.

MR. BUTLER: Terrific.

1 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Anything else? Well, 2 thank you all for getting up early this morning. And 3 you should be receiving a fax next Tuesday, and that 4 should lay out for you what the agenda will be, whether or not there are pending matters, or whether 5 6 or not the call will be cancelled. 7 MS. WHITE: This is Nancy White again, 8 Commissioner Johnson. Just to probably give everybody 9 a heads up, we do have three sets of discovery from 10 the Florida Interexchange Carriers Association. 11 think objections are due on them on two sets on 12 Monday, I think, and a third set on Tuesday. I have not even looked through them, so I'm not saying there 13 will be objections, but that's a distinct possibility. 15 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. Very well. 16 MS. WHITE: That may have to be the subject 17 of the call, at least part of it, next week, so I wanted to give people a heads up. 19 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay, Nancy. We will 20 be prepared to address that if we need to and, if not, we'll just move forward. 21 22 MR. WIGGINS: Commissioner, could I ask a question about that? 23 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 24 Pat?

Yes.

MR. WIGGINS:

Is this Pat Wiggins? 1 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Could you identify yourself for the court reporter? 2 MR. WIGGINS: This is Pat Wiggins, dropping 3 his phone, actually. (Laughter) 4 5 I'm just thinking ahead -- which I'm just doing it for a change of pace -- but I've been out for 6 about three weeks, but my understanding is, is that 7 the parties, to the extent practical, are cooperating 8 in terms of discovery. And, for example, the 9 discovery that FIXCA sent out, I had an opportunity to 10 look at before it went out. 11 12 Nancy, if in fact you do need to object to 13 any of the questions, how do you contemplate handling argument about that? I mean, it doesn't make sense to have 14 people arguing against just you. 15 16 MS. WHITE: No. I was assuming that if 17 FIXCA sets -- whoever FIXCA appointed as their 18 spokesman, whether it was someone from the McWhirter, Reeves firm or --19 20 MR. WIGGINS: Or whomever. MS. WHITE: Or whomever. But I would 21 certainly hope it wouldn't be only one person. 22 23 MR. WIGGINS: All right. Then I quess that's something we better work out among ourselves, 24

if you object.

MS. WHITE: I mean, it's the Association 1 that sent the discovery, so I would assume it would be 21 the Association and not the individual members that 3 would ---4 MR. WIGGINS: Right. 5 MS. WHITE: -- would argue the objections 6 with me, and I would expect one person to be selected. 7 Now, I don't care whether it's, you know, 8 you or an AT&T lawyer or someone from the firm that's 9 representing FIXCA, but I would expect one attorney to 11 do the arguing. MR. WIGGINS: Commissioner Johnson, just 12 what I was thinking here is that I think those of us 13 who are not aligned with BellSouth in this proceeding have committed to cooperating procedurally in every 15 way possible, so it looks more like a bilateral kind of a deal rather than a multi-party war. 17 l COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Very good. That 18 would help this process. 19 MR. WIGGINS: But if for some reason it 20 turns out there's tension in discovery, or anything 21 like that, it could very well end up Nancy could not 22 be receiving ---23 MS. WHITE: No, and I understand that. 24

I understand that, but, you know, I mean, I guess to

some extent, Commissioner Johnson, I guess I would have a problem if I'm arguing over discovery from a particular party, in this case the Florida

Interexchange Carriers Association, then I would have a problem with a party who was not part of that discovery reviewing it as well.

MR. WIGGINS: That makes perfect sense to me. The only reason I mentioned it was, is that if you send out an objection, and I'm talking with Vicki and I say that I'd really like to have this mentioned in your argument, and she says, no, that's crazy, Pat, I'm not going to embarrass myself, that's fine, and that's probably the way it ought to be; but then that will probably have an effect on to the extent of whether or not I feel like I need to send out my own.

And, really, my clarifying was more for purposes of coordination among FIXCA and ourselves rather than trying to put you on the spot saying you need to respond to more than one person.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Very well. Any other issues?

Seeing none, thank you all for calling in this morning, and you will hear from us no later than next Tuesday late afternoon. Thank you.
