

RESOLUTION NO. 96-62

A RESOLUTION RESCINDING FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION JURISDICTION OVER INVESTOR-OWNED WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS IN FLAGLER COUNTY.

WHEREAS, Florida law permits counties through their boards of county commissioners to decide whether the provisions for Florida Public Service Commission ("PSC") jurisdiction shall be operative for investor-owned water and wastewater systems located exclusively in their counties, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Flagler County during the Florida Legislature's Sunset Review of the Florida Public Service Commission resolved to come under PSC jurisdiction on May 5, 1980 for investor-owned water and wastewater systems located in Flagler County, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby finds that the May 5, 1980 action of the Board to authorize PSC jurisdiction was a resolution declaring that the County would be subject to the provisions of Florida Chapter 367, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature acknowledged Flagler County's resolution to subject its investor-owned water and wastewater systems to PSC jurisdiction in the Sunset Review legislation, and

WHEREAS, the PSC has exercised regulatory jurisdiction over investor-owned water and wastewater systems in Flagler County since July 1, 1980, a period exceeding ten (10) continuous years, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature allows counties through their boards of county commissioners to reinstate their own regulatory authority and exclude themselves from PSC jurisdiction over investor-owned water and wastewater utilities located exclusively within their counties if the county has been under such jurisdiction for at least ten (10) continuous years, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that the citizens of Flagler County will be better served by the County regulating investor-owned water and wastewater systems, and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes prescribe minimum conditions for a county's exercise of regulatory jurisdiction which the Board of County Commissioners has reviewed and considered, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Flagler
County has determined to reinstate the County's regulatory
authority and to be excluded henceforth from the provisions
for PSC jurisdiction over investor-owned water and wastewater
systems located exclusively within Flagler County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FLAGLER COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 367.171(1), Florida
Statutes, and its home rule powers under Florida Law, the
Board of County Commissioners of Flagler County rescinds its
May 5, 1980 resolution electing to be subject to the
provisions for PSC jurisdiction over investor-owned water and

wastewater utilities located within Flagler County whose service does not transverse the County's boundaries.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 367.171(1), Florida Statutes, and its home rule powers under Florida Law, the Board of County Commissioners of Flagler County hereby excludes itself from the provisions for such jurisdiction and reinstates its regulatory authority over investor-owned water and wastewater utilities located within Flagler County whose service does not transverse the County's boundaries.

Effective immediately, the Board of County Section 3. Commissioners of Flagler County exercises jurisdiction over investor-owned water and wastewater utilities located within Flagler County whose service does not transverse the County's boundaries, pursuant and subject to the standards and requirements of Section 367.171, Florida Statutes.
