

Dear Representative Crady:

Thank you for your letter of November 22, 1996, outlining your concerns with the possible change in the area code for Jacksonville from 904 to 850. The area covered by the 904 area code extends across the northern part of Florida and includes the Daytona Beach, Jacksonville, Tallahassee, Panama City and Pensacola areas. The present 904 area code is expected to run out of numbers in the second quarter of 1998 and some relief plan must be implemented prior to that date.

The Florida Public Service Commission was petitioned by BellSouth to make a decision and order a specific plan of relief. In November, the Commission held public hearings in the five cities listed above to enable citizens to express their opinions. A final hearing on this matter was held on December 9, 1996. The evidence gathered in this hearing along with the testimony from the public hearings and letters such as yours will be weighed by the Commission staff who will make a recommendation to the Commission. The Commission is currently scheduled to decide on the appropriate relief plan at its January 21, 1997, Agenda Conference.

As you noted, one of the proposed plans would change the area code for the Jacksonville area; however, others would not. I am attaching a bulletin that the Commission distributed at its public hearings to give you more information about the various proposals currently before the Commission.

I am unable to comment on the merits of this case because it is a pending docket. Also, Florida Law requires that I place a copy of your letter and my response on the record of the proceeding and allow the parties an opportunity to respond.
