ALLTEL FLORIDA, INC'S AND MORTHEAST FLORIDA TELEPHONE COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUNENT ON JOINT MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

ALLTEL Florida, Inc. ("ALLTEL") and Northeast Florida Telephone Company, Inc. ("Northeast"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.058, Florida Administrative Code, file this Request for Oral Argument on their Joint Motion for Reconsideration of Order No. PSC-97-0138-FOF-TL (the "Order"), and state:

- The Joint Motion for Oral Argument raises important issues affecting a large number of telecommunications customers in Florida.
- 2. One of those issues is the relative jurisdiction of the Florida Public Service Commission, the North American Numbering Council and the Federal Communications Commission over NPA assignments and numbering plans generally, and the potential for a time consuming numbering dispute if the Commission does not reconsider its decision to adopt Option 4.
- 3. Other issues raised include the orderly administration of numbering resources nationwide and the interplay between the implementation of NPA relief and the implementation of permanent local number portability in the Jacksonville LATA in 1998, and the

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resulting burden to carriers and confusion to customers the interplay will cause.

- 4. The relative jurisdiction of the relevant agencies, the orderly administration of numbering resources nationwide, and the ramifications of permanent number portability are complex issues. Oral Argument will aid the Commission's comprehension and evaluation of these complex issues, which may be issues of first impression before the Commission, by enabling the parties to provide input on the issues raised in the motion.
- 5. This is an important docket with important ramifications for the future. Oral Argument will promote the exchange of information, is in the public interest and should be granted.
