PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule and rule amendment is to codify Commission practice of requiring alternative local exchange companies and shared tenant service (STS) providers to meet service standards for the provision of "911" related services. The proposed rule and rule amendment also requires access to 911 emergency service to be maintained for the duration of any temporary disconnect for non-payment of a residential subscriber's service in order to provide for the health, safety and welfare of those, who for whatever circumstances, have had their telephone service disconnected. The effect of these proposed rules is to assure that the provision of 911 emergency service by both ALECs and STS providers is at least equal that to the service provided by the incumbent local exchange company (ILECs).

SUMMARY: The proposed rule would require ALECS to provide 911 service to their basic telecommunications customers on a level at least equivalent to the ILECs. In addition, proposed changes would require ALECs and STS providers to maintain access to 911 emergency service for the duration of any temporary disconnection for non-

payment of a residential subscriber's local service, effective July 1, 1997.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COST: Direct and transitional costs to the Commission, governmental entities, and the service providers were identified as being potentially significant but were not quantified. Ratepayers would benefit from the service standards. Potential additional costs were identified for small businesses.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

THE FULL TEXT OF THESE PROPOSED RULES IS:

- (1) Each provider of alternative local exchange telecommunications service shall make access to 9-1-1 emergency services available to each of its basic telecommunications service customers at a level at least equivalent to the service provided by the incumbent local exchange company.
- (2) By July 1, 1997, access to 911 services shall be maintained for the duration of any temporary disconnection for non-payment of a residential subscriber's local service.
