CITIZENS' RESPONSE IN OPPOSITION TO THE MOTION FOR STAY OF ORDER NO. PSC-97-0175-FOF-WS FILED BY FLORIDA WATER SERVICES CORPORATION, F/K/A SOUTHERN STATES UTILITIES, INC.

The Citizens of Florida ("Citizens"), by and through Jack Shreve, Public Counsel, file this response in opposition to the motion for stay of order no. PSC-97-0175-FOF-WS pending disposition of a motion for reconsideration filed by Florida Water Services Corporation, f/k/a Southern States Utilities, Inc. ("Southern States" or "Florida Water") on February 28, 1997.

1. Over one year ago the Commission issued an order that placed all of Southern States' systems except one -- Spring Hill -- on modified stand alone rates. Southern States readily acceded to that order. The order granted Southern States an interim rate increase simultaneously with the implementation of modified stand alone

rates for all of those systems. The order, however, inadvertently failed to address the Spring Hill system. Spring Hill was not part of the interim rate increase order in docket 950495-WS.

- 2. Commission order PSC-97-0175-FOF-WS recognizes that the Commission had intended to place all systems on modified stand alone rates at the same time. The order corrects this matter by finally placing Spring Hill on modified stand alone rates, just like all of the other systems, and makes the change from uniform rates to modified stand alone rates a revenue neutral matter for Southern States.
- 3. The Commission's order is correct, and Southern States is unlikely to prevail on an appeal of the order. The Commission should deny the request for a stay.

WHEREFORE, the Citizens request the Commission to deny the motion for stay filed by Southern States on February 28, 1997.
