CASE BACKGROUND

On August 26, 1996, WinStar Wireless of Florida, Inc. (WinStar) filed a petition for arbitration of certain terms and conditions of a proposed interconnection and resale agreement with GTE Florida Incorporated (GTEFL), pursuant to the provisions of 47 USC Section 252(b) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. The parties initially agreed that the issues presented by the petition could be addressed by the Commission in an informal proceeding pursuant to the provisions of Section 120.57(2), Florida Statutes. The parties were unable, however, to agree to a stipulation of material facts upon which they would base briefs on the issues for the Commission's consideration. Therefore, the parties requested an evidentiary hearing on the issues pursuant to the provisions of Section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes. A hearing was convened on January 23, 1997. At the start of the hearing WinStar informed the Commission that the parties had resolved all of the unresolved issues, and it withdrew its request for arbitration. staff's recommendation to close this arbitration docket since there are no pending issues for the Commission to address.
