## BELLSOUTH TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC.'S RESPONSE TO MOVANTS' REQUEST FOR OFFICIAL RECOGNITION

COMES NOW, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth" or "Company"), hereby files its response to the Request for Official Recognition filed by the Florida Competitive Carriers Association ("FCCA"), MCI Telecommunications Corporation ("MCI"), and AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc. ("AT&T") hereinafter referred to as (the "Movants") Request for Official Recognition of the decision of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") in Docket No. 97-121 (Order No. 97-228, dated June 26, 1997). BellSouth states the following:

- 1. BellSouth has no objection to this Commission's taking official recognition of FCC Order No. 97-228. BellSouth, however, does take exception to the Movant's argument concerning what effect, if any, this Order has on the Movants' pending Motion.
- 2. BellSouth is opposed to the continued efforts of the Movants to unduly narrow this proceeding, thereby hamstringing the Commission's development of a full record. It is the role of the FCC to make the determination

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as to whether BellSouth's application meets the requirement of Track A or Track B or a combination thereof, not that of this Commission. The FCC's decision was based on facts specific to Southwestern Bell Company at the time of that Company's application to the FCC. It is clear from the Act that Track B is open unless and until a competing provider is providing telephone exchange service to residential and business subscribers either exclusively or predominantly over its own telephone exchange service facilities. Moreover, the FCC specifically stated that the FCC had not reached the "question of whether a potential competitor's interconnection agreement must contain all fourteen items of the competitive checklist in order for a BOC to demonstrate its compliance with the competitive checklist in Section 271(c)(2)(B)." (Paragraph 59).

WHEREFORE, BellSouth requests that this Commission disallow the argument set forth in the Movant's Request.
