Dear Ms. Bigalski:

I am submitting herewith the application and filing fee for interexchange telephone service within the State of Florida as you had advised we are required to do. Although there may be omissions from this application, I am nevertheless submitting it with the intention of further supplementing it the future as may be necessary.

I respectfully call your attention to the fact that we do not directly provide service in the state of Florida. We are resellers of bulk time to various phone card companies who purchase this time from us in New York and who, in turn, then sell that time to end users through telephone calling cards that they issue. It is conceivable, and I am sure that it has happened, that some of the customers of these various phone card companies would travel to Florida where they would use their cards to place a telephone call from within your state. Actually, that would be our only connection to the state of Florida albeit it twice removed -- from us, to our customer, and, ultimately, to the end user who might travel to Florida and use the card in your state.

As I had indicated to you, I would prefer to rely upon the side of caution and file this application rather than to possibly incur penalties and fines.
