MR. HASWELL: I'm John Haswell of Chardler Lang & Haswell, P.O. Box 23279, Gainesville, Florida, 3 on behalf of Clay Electric Cooperative, Inc. MR. LOGAM: Mark Logan of Bryant Miller and Olive, on behalf of Florida Power & Light Company, and I'd also like to enter an appearance of Patrick Bryan, in-house counsel for FP&L. Mr. Bryan is not here today but will be at the hearing on the 27th. 9 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Let me make sure I've got this. Hang on one second. 10 11 Okay. Are there any preliminary matters? MS. JAYE: None that we are aware of. 12 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. So then let's 13 just go through this section by section, if there are 14 any questions we'll stop and deal with it then. 15 16 Corrections or changes to the case background. Corrections or changes to the order 17 18 witness list, order of witnesses. 19 MR. HASWELL: Commissioner, I believe FP&L has some issue numbers to add to the order of witnesses. 21 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. 22 23

Mr. Noble and Mr. Brill for FP&L on rebuttal, they would both have the following issues, 6, 8, 9 and 10 through 13. 3 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Is that it, 5 Mr. Logan? 6 MR. LOGAN: Yes, sir, thank you. 7 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Nothing from 8 Clay, right? 9 MR. HASWELL: No changes to Clay's. 10 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Corrections or changes to the basic positions. 11 12 MR. HASWELL: None from Clay. 13 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Corrections or changes to the issues and positions? Do you want to go issue 15 by issue or are we fine with --16 MS. JAYE: I think going issue by issue at this point would be very fruitful. 18 COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Issue 1. 19 MR. HASWELL: Clay's position is stated properly. COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Issue 2. 21 MR. HASWELL: Commissioner, I believe we 22 have a stipulation to Issue 2 and Clay is satisfied 23 24 with it.

MS. JAYE: FP&L.

1	MR. LOGAN: That is correct with respect to
2	Issue 2 as well. This is language that I believe
3	Staff has worked out, and it's acceptable to FP&L.
4	COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Issue 3.
5	MR. HASWELL: Clay's position is stated
6	accurately.
7	COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Issue 4. Issue 5.
8	Issue 6. And I see that I believe you have worked
9	out or stipulated Issue 7.
10	MS. JAYE: We have not reached a stipulation
11	on that. Staff has not seen that the parties are in
12	agreement.
13	COMMISSIONER GARCIA: And the parties are
14	not in agreement?
15	MS. JAYE: They are not in agreement, no,
16	sir.
17	COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Not in agreement,
18	okay.
19	MS. JAYE: We are working on that, however,
20	and it may be worked out shortly after this
21	prehearing.
22	COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Very well. So we move
23	on. 8. 9. 10. 11. 12. 13.
24	MR. LOGAN: Commissioner Garcia, on Issue
25	13, we had a brief conference with Staff prior to the
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prehearing on this issue. The issue is phrased, I think, in two parts, and it would appear to FP&L that Staff's response is kind of a singular response to the second half of that issue, and I just wanted to point that out. Staff feels it's, I guess, a hypothetical question, but we think that the Commission's rules that govern resolution of these territorial disputes contemplate this kind of two-step process. And we just wanted to note that there does not appear to be an answer or a position taken on the first part of that issue.

COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Mr. Logan, are we speaking about Issue 13?

MS. JAYE: Yes, sir.

MR. HASWELL: Commissioner, I think what

Mr. Logan means is that he's concerned that the answer

by Staff assumes -- or they haven't answered whether

all factors are equal. And the way we see the issue

is, that question, the customer preference would come

into play if all other factors are equal, so that's

still an open issue itself.

MS. JAYE: Staff wishes to clarify that they are not making any sort of a prejudgment concerning customer preference at this point, except to say if everything else is determined to be equal, the

customer has made a decision and that is a definite hypothetical.

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COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Well, Mr. Logan, I see it also in that way, so we'll leave it the way it is. I don't think we need to rephrase that.

MR. LOGAN: Thank you, Commissioner. We appreciate Staff's clarification.

COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Okay. Issue 14. Are we anywhere near a stipulation here?

MR. HASWALL: Yes, sir.

MR. LOGAN: Yes, sir, I believe we have a stipulation on that issue.

COMMISSIONER GARCIA: Very good. Good, thank you. Issue 15. And we go to the exhibit list, any corrections or changes?

MR. HASWELL: No, sir.

COMMISSIONER GARCIA: All right. Counsel, is there anything else that needs to be taken up?

MR. LOGAN: Commissioner Garcia, I just wanted to bring to your and Staff's attentions, I've had a discussion with Mr. Haswell this morning, we have some outstanding discovery issues which we are attempting to work out today. If we are not able to, then there would be some sort of motion filed with respect to those discovery issues. And I just wanted

to alert staff that that is something that would potentially have to be dealt with prior to the hearing 3 but, hopefully, we can work out an accommodation. COMMISSIONER GARCIA: I hope so, too; and I think Staff hopes so, too. I just want to thank you Staff and gentlemen. My father has a very important 7 doctor's appointment down here, so I was forced to come down here. I appreciate you allowing me to do it this way. And I appreciate the swiftness of the process. Thank you very much. I appreciate it. If 10 that's it, we will adjourn the hearing. MS. JAYE: Very good. Thank you, sir. 12 13 MR. LOGAN: Thank you.
