Notice is hereby given that Sanlando Utilities Corporation (Sanlando or utility) has applied to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) for approval of a Reuse Project Plan and increase in rates for wastewater service provided to its customers in Seminole County, Florida. This application is being processed under PSC Docket No. 971186-SU.

THE APPLICATION

The applicant's St. Johns River Water Management District (SJWMD) Consumptive Use Permit Number 2-117-0006UR2, issued November 11, 1997, and proposed renewal of their Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Wastewater Permit Number FL0036251 require that the Utility implement a reuse program. To satisfy the permit conditions, the Utility proposes to construct a reuse treatment facility and transmission and distribution mains. project is designed to provide reclaimed water to four customersthree golf courses and a commercial nursery. The applicant has requested that the Commission establish reuse rates and increase wastewater rates to recover the cost of the Reuse Project. rate structures are proposed. The first proposed rate structure places all costs with the wastewater customers. It addresses the initial situation where no rouse irrigation customers are available. The second proposed rate divides the costs among the wastewater customers and the reuse irrigation customers. addresses the situation where the facilities are constructed and all four reuse irrigation customers are connected. irrigation customers become available the Utility commensurately reduce the additional rates being charged the wastewater customers until they fall to the lower proposed rate.

This application is being filed pursuant to Section 367.0817, Florida Statutes, which provides that all prudent costs of a reuse project shall be recovered in a utility's rates. The Florida Legislature has found that reuse benefits water, wastewater, and reuse customers. Section 367.0817, Florida Statutes, requires the PSC to allow a utility to recover the costs of a reuse project from the utility's water, wastewater, or reuse customers, or any combination thereof, as it deems appropriate. Therefore, while the utility has proposed that the entire cost of the reuse project be recovered from its wastewater rates, the PSC may find it appropriate for the costs to be shared in a different manner.

SYNOPSIS OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF REUSE PROJECT PLAN AND INCREASE FOR WASTEWATER RATES

Applicant, Sanlando Utilities, Corp. (hereinafter "Applicant"), has applied to the Florida Public Service Commission ("The Commission") for approval of a Reuse Project Plan and for increase in rates for wastewater service provided to its customers in Seminole County, Florida.

- 1. The Application is being filed pursuant to the provisions of Section 367.0817, Florida Statutes, which provides that all prudent costs of a reuse project shall be recovered through rates and charges. According to that statute, reuse benefits water, wastewater, and reuse customers, and the costs of a reuse project are recovered from the utility's water, wastewater, or reuse customers, or any combination thereof as deemed appropriate by the Commission. The Applicant has proposed that the entire cost of the reuse project be recovered from an increase in its rates charged to wastewater customers, and the establishment of rates for reuse customers.
- 2. The Applicant has requested that the Commission establish a new reuse rate and grant a wastewater rate increase in order to recover the cost of its Reuse Project Plan. The Commission has not acted on this request as of the date of this Synopsis.

- 6. After the project is completed the Utility anticipates the addition of up to three golf courses and a commercial nursery as reuse water customers. Whether those customers can be required to take reuse water at any cost is a function of St. Johns River Water Management District determining that the rates approved by the Commission for the reuse water to be paid by the golf courses are "economically feasible." Applicant has no control over whether the Utility will have customers eligible and willing to pay for reused water and has requested that the Commission approve rates which will recover all costs of the reuse facility from existing wastewater customers until reuse customers are obtained.
- 7. When reuse water customers are available to take the reuse effluent, then it is anticipated that the approved rate structure which results from this limited proceeding will apply to those customers, reducing the rates charged to the existing wastewater customers of the Applicant for the reuse facility's construction and operation. The Utility will, upon existence of reuse customers eligible and willing to pay for reused water, apply the following applicable reuse rates and will commensurately reduce the additional rates being charged to the existing wastewater customers as approved by the Commission. Thereafter, pursuant to Section 367.0817 (Florida Statutes 1996), it is anticipated that the Commission will implement a proceeding to true-up the costs of the reuse project and the resulting rates.

- analysis of the actual costs of operation and maintenance of the Applicant's reuse system, along with the analysis of the additional investment of the Applicant in this system. Another issue may be the proper allocation of these prudent costs and investments so that the appropriate ratepayer pays for these costs and investments.
- 11. A description of the rate-making process and the time schedules for the proposed rate change is as follows:

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 367.0817 and 403.064, Florida Statutes, the Applicant has filed its application, satisfied the statutory requirements and provided additional information in order to demonstrate the actual anticipated costs of the Reuse Project Plan.

This case will be processed under the Proposed Agency Action process as described in Section 367.0817(2), Florida Statutes.

As part of the discovery process, the Commission Staff schedules a customer meeting in the Applicant's service area to take customer testimony on quality of service, rate structure, and other comments on the proposed Reuse Project Plan and proposed rates. After the Staff investigations have been completed, and after the customer meeting, the Staff prepares a recommendation to be considered by the full Commission at a regularly scheduled Agenda Conference in Tallahassee. Since the case has not been to hearing at this point, interested persons are allowed to address the Commission at the Agenda Conference when the case is being considered. The Commission votes to adopt, reject, or modify the Staff Recommendation at the Agenda Conference. A "Proposed Agency Action" Order is prepared and issued. The Order becomes final if no one protests it within a 21-day protest period. This entire process usually takes approximately five months. If the case is protested, the case will be processed similar to a

major rate case. A formal prehearing and hearing have been set in case a substantially affected person protests the Commission's Proposed Agency Action Order.
