2	(Hearing convened at 1:30 p.m.)
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Call the prehearing to
4	order.
5	MR. COX: Pursuant to notice issued May 1st,
6	1998, this time and place have been set for a
7	prehearing conference in Docket Nc. 971399-TP,
8	petition of BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. to lift
9	marketing restrictions imposed by Order
10	No. PSC-96-1569-FOF-TP.
11	COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances.
12	MR. COX: We have two parties on the line.
13	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Why don't we start with
14	you, Rick, and then we'll take who's on the line.
15	MR. MELSON: Richard Melson appearing on
16	behalf of MCI Telecommunications Corporation. I'd
17	also like to enter an appearance on behalf of
18	Thomas K. Bond at the address shown in the draft
19	prehearing order. Mr. Bond will be handling the
20	hearing.
21	MR. McGLOTHLIN: Joe McGlothlin for the
22	Florida Competitive Carriers Association.
23	MS. RULE: Marsha Rule for AT&T.
24	COMMISSIONER CLARK: And who do we have on
25	the line?

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MS. KEYER: Mary Keyer with BellSouth 1 Telecommunications, Inc. 2 MS. AUGER: And Barbara Auger on behalf of 3 Time Warner. 4 MR. COX: Will Cox on behalf of the 5 Commission Staff. 6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: I have read the 7 prehearing order. Is there anything we need to take 8 9 up? MR. COX: Staff has several -- two minor 10 preliminary matters. I don't know if the parties have 11 any additional matters. One I do know the parties 12 would like to talk about, which is the position of 13 MCI, AT&T and the FCCA on Issue 1; and I believe 14 Ms. Rule would like to address you on that. 15 MS. RULE: Commissioner, we've split up our 16 position in Issue 2 to provide a separate position for 17 Issue 1, and I've already provided --18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Oh, okay. 19 MS. RULE: And I've already provided the 20 language to Staff, but for the people on the telephone 21 I'll try and make it intelligible. I'm happy to fax 22 copies out later if I can't make it clear. 23 On Issue 1, instead of "See position on 24 Issue 2," it will say "No," and then it will continue 25

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with the first, one, two, three sentences of the 1 position on Issue 2. 2 So it will start out "The Commission should 3 not alter," and then it will end "for interLATA 4 purposes." And that will be our position on Issue 1. 5 For Issue 2, the position will be "No relief б 7 is appropriate, thus, the Commission should not alter the requirements," and then continue again with the 8 first sentence from the position on Issue 2. 9 At the end of that sentence skip down --10 11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Wait a minute. I'm confused. It will read "No relief is appropriate," 12 13 and then start with "thus"? MS. RULE: Comma, "thus, the Commission 14 should not alter." 15 MR. COX: It's the first sentence of their 16 17 position on Issue 2. After the "thus the." MS. RULE: And at the completion of that 18 sentence, skip down to the fourth sentence, which is 19 right where we left off. And that starts out 20 "BellSouth's own evidence shows that," and then 21 continue with the rest of the position statement. 22 23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. MS. RULE: I realize it's a little difficult 24 to follow, so I gave it to Mr. Cox in writing. 25

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MR. COX: The only other matter that Staff 1 2 had was to know if the parties wish to combine the direct and rebuttal testimony for the hearing. 3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I don't have a 4 problem with that. 5 6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Barbara, was that you? 7 MS. KEYER: No. That was Mary Keyer with BellSouth. 8 9 COMMISSIONER CLARK: I'm sorry, Mary. We will combine direct and rebuttal unless 10 11 anyone objects. MR. McGLOTHLIN: No objection. 12 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. 13 MR. COX: Actually there was a third item I 14 forgot. We inadvertently left Ms. Auger off the 15 appearance list in the draft prehearing order, and we 16 would include her. 17 COMMISSIONER CLARK: So it will be Ms. Seay, 18 19 Ms. Geer, and Ms. Auger? 20 MR. COX: No. Ms. Auger will be appearing on behalf of Time Warner. They don't have a witness 21 22 in this proceeding. COMMISSIONER CLARK: I guess my question is, 23 what's the order? 24 MR. COX: The order is Ms. Geer and then 25

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Ms. Seay, I believe. Actually -- but it has it the 1 opposite. I see what you're saying. It would make 2 more sense, I think, to have Ms. Geer --3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Ms. Seay and then 4 5 Ms. Auger? MR. COX: Ms. Auger is an attorney for Time 6 Warner. She's not a witness in this proceeding. 7 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, is she going to 8 9 appear as a witness? MR. COX: I was referring to the appearances 10 of counsel. 11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: I'm sorry. 12 MR. COX: That's okay. I didn't make that 13 clear. Just on the first page of the prehearing 14 15 order. COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. 16 MR. COX: Her appearance on behalf of Time 17 Warner. And I would recommend -- actually we have 18 Ms. Seay first, but I would recommend Ms. Geer, 19 because the petitioner in this case was BellSouth. 20 COMMISSIONER CLARK: That sounds fine to me. 21 Any other changes? (No response.) 22 Anything else we need to take up? (No 23 response.) 24 Thank you very much. This hearing is 25

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adjourned. 1 MR. McGLOTHLIN: I had something. 2 3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: I'm sorry, Joe. MR. MCGLOTHLIN: Could we have five minutes 4 5 for party opening statements? COMMISSIONER CLARK: Sure. We'll make note 6 7 of that. MR. MoGLOTHLIN: And since there are only 8 two things to respond to, could we have 120 words for 9 the posthearing statements of position? That was done 10 in the BSE case and I think it would be appropriate 11 here, too; in other words, some relief from the 12 13 limitation of 50 words. COMMISSIONER CLARK: You mean 120 words for 14 each position? 15 MR. McGLOTHLIN: Yes. 16 COMMISSIONER CLARK: That's fine with me. 17 But, Joe, I have to keep telling you, I think the 18 longer it is, the more you lose your audience. But 19 when there are only two issues, I would agree with 20 you, it's probably harmless. Is that all right with 21 Staff? 22 MR. COX: That would be fine. 23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. So we'll allow 24 120 words per issue. I want to make it clear that 25

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it's just because there are two issues, and it seems 1 relatively innocuous in this case. Okay. 2 MS. RULE: I have a question, Commissioner, 3 of Staff. Is Time Warner taking positions? 4 MR. COX: Time Warner has not filed a 5 prehearing statement. 6 MS. RULE: I see. Thank you. 7 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, that's a good 8 question. Ms. Auger, what is your intention? I 9 guess -- are they too late for positions? They'll 10 have to take the --11 MS. AUGER: I have spoken with the Staff on 12 this as this matter has progressed, and as it's 13 progressed, we're supportive of the FCCA's position, 14 and we're not taking an active role in the hearing. 15 COMMISSIONER CLARK: So you won't even be 16 17 there? MS. AUGER: No, we'll be there, but we're 18 not going to take -- we will probably not take any 19 active role, but just monitor. 20 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Is that 21 satisfactory to all the parties, that they are 22 supportive of FCCA, MCI, and AT&T's position? 23 MS. RULE: Okay. I was just idly wondering; 24 25 that's all, wondering what to expect at the hearing.

2	MR. COX: That's all that Staff has.
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you all very
4	much. The prehearing is adjourned.
