<u>Issue 3</u>: What corrective reserve measures should be made?
<u>Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends a reserve transfer of \$93,849 from Automobiles, Account 392.1, to the reserve for Light Trucks, Account 392.2.

APPROVED

Issue 4: Should the current approved annual accrual for dismantlement for Gulf Power Company be revised?

Recommendation: Yes. The annual provision for dismantlement beginning January 1, 1998 should be \$5,661,332 as shown on Attachment A of staff's June 4, 1998 memorandum, page 13. This represents a \$981,411 increase over the current approved annual accrual.

<u>Issue 5</u>: What are the appropriate depreciation rates and amortization schedules?

Recommendation: The recommended lives, net salvages, reserves, and resultant depreciation rates are shown on Attachment B of staff's memorandum, page 14. These rates result in an increase in annual depreciation expense by about \$2.7 million based on January 1, 1998 investments as shown on Attachment C of staff's memorandum, pages 15 - 16.
