RE: DOCKET NO. 971466-WS - Application for tariff modification regarding miscellaneous service charges by Cinnamon Ridge Utilities, Inc. in Citrus County.

Issue 1: Should the utility's proposed miscellaneous service charges and customer deposit be approved?

Recommendation: Yes. The utility's proposed miscellaneous service charges and customer deposit should be approved. If the utility files revised tariff sheets within thirty days of the issuance date of the order which are consistent with the Commission's vote, staff should be given administrative authority to approve the revised tariff sheets upon staff's verification that the tariffs are consistent with the Commission's decision. If the revised tariff sheets are filed and approved, the revised miscellaneous service charges and customer deposit should be implemented on or after the stamped approval date of the tariff sheets pursuant to Rule 25-30.475(2), Florida Administrative Code, provided customers have received notice. The utility should provide proof that customers have received notice within 10 days after the date of the notice.
