MOTION TO STRIKE

COMES NOW FLORIDA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMPANY (FPUC), by and through its undersigned counsel, and hereby moves the Commission to strike the Complainant's exceptions filed in this cause. As grounds therefore, FPUC would show the following:

- The Judge filed his Recommended Order with the Commission on June 11, 1998.
- The Complainant filed exceptions thereto on June 29, 1998.
- 3. Pursuant to § 120.57(1)(I), the deadline for filing exceptions to the Recommended Order was 15 days from the filing of the Order, that is, June 26, 1998.
- Complainant has failed to meet that deadline, and the exceptions are therefore untimely.
- 5. The Complainant has failed to offer any proof of excusable neglect, and, therefore, the exceptions must be stricken. See Hamilton County Bd. of County Comm'rs v. State of Florida, Dep't of Envtl. Regulation, 587 So.2d 1378 (Fla. 1st DCA 1991).
 - Furthermore, Rule 28-206.104(f) requires that a

certificate of service shall accompany each document filed with the Public Service Commission.

- 7. As provided for in the Rules of Civil Procedure, a certificate of service is one party's attestation and certification that, in fact, a particular filing was sent to the other party on a particular day.
- 8. However, Complainant's exceptions were mailed to the undersigned well after the June 24, 1998, Certificate of Service, and after the June 29, 1998 date of filing, as evidenced by the June 30, 1998, post-mark on the envelope in which it was received by the undersigned at her office on July 2, 1998. See Exhibit "A".

WHEREFORE, FLORIDA PUBLIC UTILITIES respectfully moves this Commission for an Order striking the Complainant's late-filed exceptions, for all the reasons aforestated.


