On September 1, 1997, the Commission voted on and approved staff's recommendation (dated August 20, 1998) for the current rate case. A Proposed Agency Action (PAA) Order is scheduled to be issued twenty days from the date of the Commission's vote. If no protests have been filed by the end of the protest period, which is 21 days from the date the PAA order is issued, the rates and charges approved by this Commission will become final. However, the utility must first submit a complete new tariff for staff's approval before the utility will be allowed to implement the rate changes. A model tariff with instructions is enclosed for your convenience. In order to expedite the tariff process, the utility should file <u>all</u> new tariff pages by October 1, 1998, in order to allow sufficient time for staff to verify the accuracy of the new tariff.

A customer notice informing the utility's customers of the Commission's approved increased rates and charges must be mailed to customers for their receipt prior to consumption at the increased rates. A copy of the customer notice must first be submitted to the Commission for staff's review and approval. Once the order is issued, I will notify you of the order number, date of issuance, and final effective date which needs to be filled in on the notice.

The rates should be effective for service rendered as of the stamped approval date on the tariff sheets provided the customers have received notice. The tariff sheets will be approved upon staff's verification that the tariffs are consistent with the Commission's decision, that the customer notice is adequate, and that any required security has been provided. The utility should provide proof of the date notice was given within 10 days after the date of the notice.

If the effective date of the new rates falls within a regular billing cycle, the initial bills at the new rate may be prorated. The old charge should be prorated based on the number of days in the billing cycle before the effective date of the new rates. The new charge should be prorated based on the number of days in the billing cycle on or after the effective date of the new rates.
