REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF PROPRIETARY DATA OF SPRINT COMMUNICATIONS COMPANY LIMITED PARTNERSHIP

Sprint Communications Company Limited Partnership ("Sprint") hereby requests confidential classification of certain data required by Order No. PSC-98-0795-FOF-TP issued in the above styled docket on June 9, 1998. The data constitutes proprietary confidential business information as defined in Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and should therefore be afforded confidential classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code. In support of this request, Sprint states as follows:

I. Summary of Confidential Information

In accordance with the requirements of Section 364.163(6), Florida Statutes and Order No. PSC-98-0795-FOF-TP, Sprint filed its detailed proprietary work papers for the 1998 switched access reductions. The work papers revealed the reduction amount effective July 1, 1998, and the projected amount for October 1, 1998. The work papers were assigned Document number 07797-98. Document number 07797-98 was returned to Sprint on September 16, 1998.

On October 1, 1998, Sprint filed its detailed proprietary work papers reflecting the access reductions effective July 1, 1998 and the actual reduction amount effective

October 1, 1998. The work papers were assigned document number 10825-98. In response to staff's request, Sprint also filed document number 07797-98 for comparison purposes. Sprint filed a Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification along with the work papers.

Sprint requests the Commission to afford the information contained in document number 07797-98 and document number 10825-98 confidential classification. Both documents contain information that is intended to be and is treated by Sprint as private and has not been disclosed. They reflect calculations of Sprint's dollar and percentage reduction impact in intrastate switched access charges. Specifically, the documents reflect Sprint's related service-by-service dollar and percentage Florida intrastate rate reductions, accomplishing flow-through, in Sprint's Consumer Services Group and Business Services Group offerings

II. Justification for Confidential Classification

In accordance with Sections 350.121 and 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, the previously described information should be classified as confidential information and afforded protection from public disclosure. The material relates to the competitive activities of Sprint and provides specific information, not otherwise availance to Sprint's competitors, regarding Sprint's intrastate traffic volumes. The information contained in documents 07797-98 and 10825-98 reflect on a service specific basis, total monthly intrastate revenues, Florida intrastate percentage figures, annualized revenues and access charges on a Florida intrastate and service specific basis. These calculations determine the total amount of flow-through required.

All of the information for which Sprint seeks confidential treatment falls within Section 364.183(e), which defines the term "proprietary confidential business information," to include "information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of information." The information contained in documents 07797-98 and 10825-98 is current and relates to a period during which the Florida intrastate interexchange market has been intensely competitive. Numerous carriers are entering the Florida market and existing carriers are increasing their marketing efforts in an attempt to attract customers. There is a multitude of new service offerings and marketing schemes being introduced. Public disclosure of the data contained in documents 07797-98 and 10825-98 would provide Sprint's competitors with information to determine the success or failure of Sprint's efforts in a given year. Sprint's competitors could then develop future marketing plans based on successes or failures of the past. Sprint, however, would not have access to this same information with respect to its competitors. Consequently, public disclosure of Sprint's information contained in documents 07798-98 and 10825-98 would give Sprint's competitors an unfair competitive advantage in the intrastate interexchange market in Florida. Based on the foregoing, the information contained in documents 07798-98 and 10825-98 constitutes proprietary confidentie' business information that must be protected from public disclosure pursuant to Section 365, 183, Florida Statutes.

III. Duration of Confidentiality

Due to the dynamic nature of competition in the State of Florida, Sprint is unable to provide a date certain by which the information filed in response to Order No. PSC-98-

0795-FOF-TP contained in documents 07798-98 and 10825-98 would no longer be proprietary and confidential.

IV. Return of Information

Sprint respectfully requests that this confidential information be returned to it after the Commission has verified compliance with Order No. PSC-98-0795-FOF-TP.

V. Conclusion

In accordance with the provisions of Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, the requested information has been provided in two forms. <u>Exhibit 1</u> is a copy of the information on which the proprietary information has been highlighted and is submitted in a separate sealed envelope labeled "CONFIDENTIAL". The information contained in <u>Exhibit 1</u> is the same information contained in what has been previously identified as document number 07797-98 and document number 10825-98. This version, which contains the complete information, should be classified as confidential information for the reasons set forth above. <u>Exhibit 2</u> is a redacted version, which contains the information in non-proprietary form.
