Dear Chairman Johnson:

On December 16, 1997, the Public Service Commission denied two petitions for declaratory statements. The petitions concerned eligibility, under the Power Plant Siting Act, of applicants who are not regulated by the PSC and who have no immediate plans to sell electric power in the retail market. The Commission determined that the petitions raised significant statewide policy issues governing the supply of electricity for the citizens of Florida.

Now pending before the Commission is a joint petition by the City of New Smyrna Beach Utilities Commission and Duke Energy New Smyrna Beach Power Company Ltd., L.L.P. (Duke Energy) for a determination of need for a 500 megawatt combined cycle electrical power plant in Volusia County (Docket No. 981042-EU). The City of New Smyrna Beach proposes to use less than 10 percent of the capacity. The rest will be sold by Duke Energy on the wholesale market. The question today is the same as it was before: whether a company that is not regulated by the Public Service Commission pursuant to Chapter 366, F.S., should be eligible to seek a determination of need.

When the Florida Electrical Power Plant Siting Act was enacted during the 1970's, no one foresaw that someday it would apply to merchant plants that do not directly serve retail customers in Florida. A fundamental change in state policy, such as is proposed by this petition, is bound to affect consumers and natural resources statewide.

I share the Commission's interest in ensuring reliable and affordable electric power for all. If the Commission believes that broadening the definition of utilities who may apply under the Power Plant Siting Act is necessary or desirable, I would welcome your recommendations for amending the law.
