NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a hearing will be held before the Florida Public Service Commission regarding the application of Lake Suzy Utilities, Inc. for certificates to operate a water and wastewater utility in Charlotte and DeSoto Counties and the application of Florida Water Services Corporation for amendment of Certificates Nos. 570-W and 496-S to add territory in Charlotte County, at the following time and place:

10:00 a.m., January 13, 1999 (January 14, 1999 also has been reserved for hearing, if necessary.) Best Western Waterfront Dolphin and Panther Rooms 300 Retta Esplanade Punta Gorda, Florida 33950

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The starting time of the second day's session, if required, will be announced at the conclusion of the prior day. The hearing may be adjourned early if all testimony is concluded.

Customers will be given the opportunity to present testimony at the beginning of the morning session on Wednesday, January 13, 1999. Additionally, an evening session will be held beginning at 6:30 p.m., Wednesday, January 13, 1999 for the purpose of hearing testimony from customers who were unable to attend the prior session.

All customers wishing to testify are urged to be present at the beginning of the sessions, since the sessions may be adjourned early if no customers are present. By providing customer testimony, a person does not become a party to the proceeding. To become an official party of record, you must file a Petition for Intervention at least five days before the final hearing, pursuant to the requirements contained in Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code.

## PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE

The purpose of this hearing is to consider the petition of Lake Suzy Utilities, Inc. for certificates to operate a water and wastewater utility in Charlotte and DeSoto Counties and the application of Florida Water Services Corporation for amendment of Certificates Nos. 570-W and 496-S to add territory in Charlotte County and any motions or other matters that may be pending at the time of the hearing. The Commission may rule on any such motions from the bench or may take the matters under advisement.

At the hearing, all parties shall be given the opportunity to present testimony and other evidence on the issues identified by the parties at the prehearing conference held on December 14, 1998. All witnesses shall be subject to cross-examination at the conclusion of their testimony.
