ORDER GRANT REQUESTS FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT OF DOCUMENT NOS. 12556-98, 12559-98, AND 12619-98

On June 30, 1998, Supra Telecommunications & Information Systems (Supra) filed a Petition for Emergency Relief Against BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth). By its Petition, Supra asks that we require BellSouth to permit Supra to physically collocate its switch equipment in BellSouth's Golden Glades and West Palm Beach Gardens Central Offices. On July 20, 1998, BellSouth filed its Answer and Response to Supra's Petition. We held an administrative hearing regarding this matter on October 21, 1998.

On November 6, 1998, BellSouth filed a request for confidential classification of late-filed deposition exhibit JR-1 for Jerry Rubin and late-filed deposition exhibit WKM-1 for W. Keith Milner, Document No. 12556-98 and referenced Document No. 11588-98. On that same day, BellSouth also filed requests for confidential treatment of the copies of its responses to Supra's First and Second Set of Interrogatories that were provided to Commission staff, Document No. 12559-98 and referenced Document No. 11590-98, and the transcript of the deposition of Barbara Cruitt, Document No. 12619-98 and referenced Document No. 11659-98. BellSouth asserts that these documents contain information that would impair its ability to compete if the information were disclosed. BellSouth states that it treats this information as confidential and proprietary information pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes. Thus, BellSouth argues that this information should be granted confidential treatment pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.

Florida law presumes that documents submitted to governmental agencies shall be public records. The only exceptions to this presumption are the specific statutory exemptions provided in the law and exemptions granted by governmental agencies pursuant to the

specific terms of a statutory provision. This presumption is based on the concept that government should operate in the "sunshine." Rule 25-22.006(4)(c), Florida Administrative Code, provides that it is the Company's burden to demonstrate that the documents fall into one of the statutory examples set out in Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, or to demonstrate that the information is proprietary confidential information, the disclosure of which will cause the Company or its ratepayers harm.

Specifically, BellSouth seeks confidential treatment of the specific lines and columns on the pages of Document No. 12556-98 that are identified in Attachment A to this Order. BellSouth argues that the information identified in Attachment A includes business plans and forecasts, which would allow competitors to have an unfair advantage if publicly disclosed. BellSouth also argues certain identified information relates that to BellSouth's marketing strategies. BellSouth claims that disclosure of this information would also give competitors an unfair advantage in the market over BellSouth. BellSouth further argues the Attachment A identifies vendor specific information contained in these latefiled deposition exhibits. BellSouth considers this information to be a trade secret the disclosure of which would impair BellSouth's ability to enter into vendor contracts with reasonable terms. Further explanation of BellSouth's rationale is included in Attachment A.

Regarding its request for confidential treatment of Document No. 12559-98, BellSouth has specifically requested confidential treatment of the lines and columns on the pages identified in Attachment B to this Order. BellSouth argues that the identified information is competitive business information the disclosure of which would impair its ability to compete. BellSouth indicates that the information includes market research and analysis that would allow BellSouth's competitors to enter and compete in the market without having to expend money and resources on market BellSouth also asserts that the research and development. information identified in Attachment B contains floor plans of BellSouth's central offices. BellSouth believes that disclosure of this information would impair its ability to keep these offices Further explanation of BellSouth's rationale is included secure. in Attachment B.

As for its request for confidential treatment of the transcript of the deposition of Barbara Cruitt, Document No. 12619-98, BellSouth has specifically requested confidential treatment of

the lines and columns on the pages identified in Attachment C to this Order. BellSouth argues that the information identified in Attachment C includes business forecasts and plans that would impair BellSouth's ability to compete if the information were disclosed. In addition, BellSouth contends that the information identified contains vendor specific prices and information negotiated by BellSouth. BellSouth asserts that disclosure of this information would inhibit BellSouth's ability to contract for goods and services at reasonable prices and on favorable terms. BellSouth states that it treats this information as a trade secret; thus, it should be granted confidential treatment in accordance with Section 364.183, Florida Statutes. Further explanation of BellSouth's rationale is included in Attachment C.

Section 364.183(3), Florida Statutes, states, in pertinent part, that proprietary confidential business information is information that

. . . is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public.

Based on the definition of proprietary confidential business information in Section 364.183(3), Florida Statutes, it appears that the information for which BellSouth seeks confidential classification is proprietary information that, if disclosed, would cause harm to the company or its ratepayers because it would impair BellSouth's ability to compete. It shall, therefore, be granted confidential treatment in accordance under Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.

Based on the foregoing, it is therefore

ORDERED by Commissioner E. Leon Jacobs, as Prehearing Officer, that BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc.'s requests for confidential treatment of Document Nos. 12556-98, and referenced Document No. 11588-98, 12559-98, and referenced Document No. 11590-98, and 12619-98, and referenced Document No. 11659-98, are hereby granted. It is further

ORDERED that pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, any confidentiality granted to the material specified herein shall expire eighteen (18) months from the date of the issuance of this Order in the absence of a renewed request for confidentiality pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes. It is further

ORDERED that this Order will be the only notification by the Commission to the parties concerning the expiration of the confidentiality time period.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.038(2), Florida Administrative Code, if issued by a Prehearing Officer; (2)

reconsideration within 15 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code, if issued by the Commission; or (3) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.

REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF LATE FILED DEPOSITION EXHIBITS NOS. 1 FOR RUBIN AND FOR MILNER FILED OCTOBER 16, 1998, IN DOCKET 980800-TP

Explanation of Proprietary Information

- 1. The subject information includes BellSouth's business plans, forecasts and other confidential business information of BellSouth. If this information were disclosed publicly, it would damage the competitive interests of BellSouth. Accordingly, this information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 364.183(3)(e).
- 2. This information reflects BellSouth's market strategy relating to it's competitive marketing position. Specifically this information discusses, describes and evaluates BellSouth's potential strategic responses to various competitive scenarios; sets forth and evaluates underlying components of specific competitive proposals along with supporting rationale such as results of market research and analysis; names of individuals assigned to certain projects; key details relating to the substance of such projects as well as developmental time frame information and implementation information; and discusses/evaluates recommendations on these potential competitive response. BellSouth's competitors can use this information to develop their own market strategy with which to thwart BellSouth's effort in this market. Thus, the disclosure of this information to BellSouth's competitors would impair BellSouth's ability to compete and is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to Section 364.183(3)(a) and (3)(e), Florida Statutes. In addition, this information is valuable as it is used by BellSouth in conducting its business and BellSouth strives to keep it secret. Therefore, this information is a trade secret which should be classified as proprietary, confidential business information exempt from the Open Records Act.
- 3. This information contains vendor specific information, and/or, vendor specific prices negotiated by BellSouth. Public disclosure of this information would impair BellSouth's ability to contract for goods and services on favorable terms. This information is valuable, it is used by BellSouth in conducting its business and BellSouth strives to keep it secret. Therefore, such information is a trade secret which should be classified as proprietary, confidential business information pursuant to Section 364.183(3) and (3)(d), Florida Statutes.
