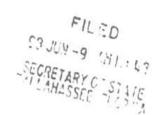

The undersigned incorporator to these Articles of Incorporation, a natural person competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida.

A. ORGANIZATION

Southeastern Services, Inc. (the Company) is engaged in the business of contracting qualified skilled labor to its marine, industrial, utility and technical customers on a time and material basis. The Company operates out of its office in Macclenney, Florida.

B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation - The financial statements of the Company have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Revenue Recognition - Billings for the bulk of the Company's activities are rendered on a weekly basis to the customers, and labor service revenues are recognized as billed.

<u>Cash and Cash Equivalents</u> - Cash as reflected on the statement of cash flows consists of bank accounts and all highly liquid debt instruments. Deposits are not included as cash on the statement of cash flows.

The Company has a contract in progress with the State of Florida Department of Transportation. The contract runs for a period of three years. It must be renewed on an annual basis at the discretion of the Department. The contract value remaining is \$500,000. The Company also has a contract with the Baker County Board of Commissioners. This contract runs for a period of four additional years. It can be cancelled at any time, without cause, upon ninety days notice to the Company.
