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# PROCEEDINGS

(Hearing convened at 11:00 a.m.)

call this prehearing to order. And, counsel, could you please read the Notice.

MR. COX: Pursuant to Notice this time and place have been set for a prehearing conference in Docket No. 990108-TP, request for arbitration concerning the complaint of The Other Phone Company Inc., doing business as Access One Communications against BellSouth Telecommunications Inc., regarding breach of resale agreement.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Thank you. We'll take appearances starting with Access One.

MR. TURKEN: This is Robert Turken of the firm of Stroock and Stroock and Lavan. I am joined by my colleague, Sean Cleary, and we represent Access One Communications, Inc.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Thank you. And BellSouth.

MR. CARVER: Phillip Carver for BellSouth, 675 West Peachtree Street, Atlanta, Georgia 30375.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: And Staff.

MR. COX: William Cox and Donna Clemons appearing on behalf of the Commission Staff.

1	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Thank you. Staff,
2	would there be any preliminary matters before we start
3	going through the prehearing order?
4	MR. COX: Yes, Commissioner Johnson. There
5	are two preliminary matters that I would recommend we
6	take up from the start. I'm not sure if the party's
7	have any others, but there's only two that I'm aware
8	of. The first is, there is a motion filed by Access
9	One to supplement the rebuttal testimony of its
LO	witness, Ken Baritz.
Ll	Staff's understanding that there is no
L2	opposition from BellSouth and Staff has no opposition
L3	to granting the motion.
L4	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. Then and it
L5	has been officially filed?
L6	MR. COX: Yes. It was filed with the filing
L7	of the supplemental rebuttal.
18	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. Show that then
L9	granted with no objection.
20	MR. COX: The other item is something that
21	we're still waiting on, but it's a stipulation on
22	Issue 4. It's an issue involving repair issues.
23	MR. TURKEN: This is Robert Turken.
24	Yesterday Michael Goggin of BellSouth and I agreed to

the language of a stipulation. Because of logistics,

we have not yet had an opportunity to have it filed with the Commission. I am authorized to read it to the Commission, and if the Commission prefers we will also file a hard copy at the beginning of the week. COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. I think we'd like to see a hard copy, but if you could, for

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purposes of the record, go ahead and read that in.

MR. TURKEN: Okay. Phil, I assume you'll be able to follow along with what I'm reading?

MR. CARVER: Yes. I have a copy here and I will just read along as you read it out loud.

MR. TURKEN: Okay. "Stipulation. Access One Communications, Inc. (Access One) and BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., (BellSouth) have agreed to resolve Issue 4 in this matter.

Issue 4 concerned the question of whether BellSouth offers the same repair scheduling options to Access One customers that it offers to its own retail customers.

BellSouth represents and confirms that it offers all ALEC customers the same repair scheduling options that it offers its own retail customers and will continue to do so.

Based on this representation, the parties believe that there is no need for the Commission to

address this issue and request that the Commission 1 delete this issue from the list of issues to be 2 3 decided in this matter." COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff. 4 5 MR. COX: That's all we have. We would hope that that hard copy would come in before the hearing, 6 7 which is scheduled for August 11th. 8 MR. TURKEN: I can assure you that it will. 9 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Is there a time 10 certain that you can have that in? 11 MR. TURKEN: The only -- the only logistics is getting it signed. 12 13 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. 14 MR. TURKEN: Phil, what I will do, there are two ways, I guess, we could have -- since we have the 15 deposition scheduled in Atlanta on Tuesday --16 17 MR. CARVER: Uh-huh. 18 MR. TURKEN: Are you going to be there? MR. CARVER: No, I won't be. I was going to 19 suggest, since you're in Miami, it may be best just to 20 have either Nancy or Michael sign it. That way it 21 22 will probably get signed Monday. 23 MR. TURKEN: Okay. Because Michael, I know 24 is not here -- is not going to be here for the next

week, so I need to have somebody in Miami I can send

1	it to. Should I send it to Nancy?
2	MR. CARVER: Yes. I think that would work
3	best.
4	MR. TURKEN: Okay. And then we will have
5	that signed on Monday and we will have that Federal
6	Expressed to Tallahassee.
7	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. Then the order
8	will reflect that stipulation as read and signed and
9	forwarded to Staff. Anything else in terms of a
10	preliminary matter?
11	MR. COX: I think that's all the preliminary
12	matters, and we're just ready to go through the order
13	itself.
14	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. What I will
15	do, gentlemen and ladies, I will just walk through
16	each page, and to the extent that there is a question,
17	a change, or an addition, please feel free to state
18	your name and I'll allow you to make your comments.
19	Page 1. (No response.)
20	Page 2. (No response.)
21	Page 3. (No response.)
22	Page 4. (No response.)
23	MR. CARVER: This is Phil Carver. One thing
24	I just wanted to suggest, although I don't have strong
25	feelings about this one way or the other, is that I

noticed in the order of witnesses, the direct 1 2 witnesses and rebuttal are listed separately. It 3 might move things along a little more quickly if 4 witnesses who had both direct and rebuttal testimony 5 took the stand one time rather than two. 6 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Uh-huh. 7 MR. CARVER: So I'd just like to suggest 8 that. 9 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: What would be the 10 pleasure of the other parties? Access One? 11 MR. TURKEN: That's fine. 12 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff? 13 MR. COX: That is fine. 14 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. We'll have --15 when the witness comes forward we'll revise this calendar -- this schedule to reflect that they will 16 17 provide their direct and their rebuttal in a 18 consolidated fashion. 19 Anything else on the order of witnesses? 20 Okay. Then going to Page 5, the basic positions of the parties. Access One, any changes or 21 22 additions? 23 MR. TURKEN: Nope. 24 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BellSouth?

MR. CARVER: No, ma'am.

1	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff has no position
2	at this time.
3	Page 7 then, Issue and Positions. Issue 1,
4	any changes?
5	MR. TURKEN: The only change that Access One
6	has, I think, is typographical. If you go down where
7	it starts the quote, the quote is only suppose to be
8	the first paragraph. Where it says, "even if
9	BellSouth was somehow correct," that's suppose to go
10	back out to the margin and that continues over to the
11	next page.
12	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. We'll reflect
13	that change.
14	MR. TURKEN: I don't think it was ever
15	intended by the Staff to be part of the quote.
16	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Sure. Sure. Okay.
17	Any other changes, Access One?
18	MR. TURKEN: No.
19	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BellSouth?
20	MR. CARVER: No changes.
21	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff has no
22	position.
23	Issue 2. Any changes, Access One?
24	MR. TURKEN: No.
25	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BellSouth?

1	MR. CARVER: No changes.
2	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: And Staff there is
3	fine.
4	Issue 3. Access One?
5	MR. TURKEN: No.
6	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BellSouth?
7	MR. CARVER: No.
8	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. And on Page
9	15, Issue 4 there, we will show the stipulated
10	language.
11	Issue 5. Access One?
12	MR. TURKEN: No.
13	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BellSouth?
14	MR. CARVER: No changes.
15	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff is fine.
16	We're now, gentlemen and ladies, on Page 17,
17	the exhibit list. Any changes, corrections or
18	additions?
19	MR. TURKEN: Well, we have a change on
20	Page 16 actually.
21	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Oh, okay. Let's go
22	back then to Page 16.
23	MR. TURKEN: On our copy, it's the beginning
24	of the exhibit list. This is Robert Turken.
25	It appears inadvertently that Exhibit KB-5

1	was omitted and what is listed as Exhibit KB-5 is		
2	really Exhibit KB-6. KB-5 is a letter from Page		
3	Miller to Ken Baritz dated September 11, 1998.		
4	MR. COX: I'm sorry. Could you repeat KB-5,		
5	please?		
6	MR. TURKEN: KB-5 should be a letter from		
7	Page Miller to Ken Baritz dated September 11, 1998.		
8	MR. COX: Okay.		
9	MR. TURKEN: What is currently listed as		
10	Exhibit KB-5 should be denominated as Exhibit KB-6.		
11	And then when you go over to Page 17 it		
12	starts off correctly again because it starts off with		
13	Exhibit KB-7.		
14	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. So, KB		
15	because my pagination is different here. KB-5 should		
16	be a letter from Page Miller to Ken		
17	MR. TURKEN: Baritz. B-A-R-I-T-Z.		
18	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Dated September 11th?		
19	MR. TURKEN: September 11, '98.		
20	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: '98.		
21	MR. TURKEN: And then what is identified as		
22	KB-6 correctly identified KB-5, just should be		
23	KB-6.		
24	COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: I'm following you.		
25	It's the February 3rd letter?		

1 MR. TURKEN: Right. 2 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Got you. Everyone 3 following that change? 4 MR. COX: Yes. 5 MR. TURKEN: On Page 17 -- well, excuse me, 6 because you have a different pagination. What you 7 have listed as Exhibit KB-9, another typographical 8 It says, agreement between BellSouth 9 Telecommunications, Inc. and The Telephone Company of Florida. After the word "of" there should be inserted 10 11 the word --12 (Door closing.) 13 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. 14 MR. TURKEN: Should be The Telephone Company 15 of Central Florida. 16 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. Got you there. 17 MR. TURKEN: Okay. 18 THE REPORTER: Wait a minute. Would you please repeat the last word of that last statement? 19 20 MR. COX: I'm sorry. Repeat that. The 21 Court reporter didn't get that. 22 MR. TURKEN: Exhibit KB-9, the word 23 "central" was missing from The Telephone Company -- it 24 currently reads, "The Telephone Company of Florida."

It should read, "The Telephone Company of Central

Florida."

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. The record will reflect that revision there, that change, clarification. Anything else Access One?

MR. TURKEN: Yes. Exhibit KB-10, we would propose that it would -- it currently reads, "letter from Page Miller to Ken Baritz enclosing the BellSouth Standard Resale Agreement." Just for purposes of clarity, we would propose, "letter from Page Miller to Ken Baritz dated July 6, 1998."

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: July 6, 1998. Okay.

MR. TURKEN: And continue on -- and this is -- again, this is just for purposes of clarity. On our Page 19, which may be your Page 20, partly identified as BS-1.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: BS-1, uh-huh.

MR. TURKEN: And, Will, this is just a proposal, so please, tell me if you agree or disagree. BS-1 currently consists of BellSouth's responses to Access One's First Request for Production. That includes a table prepared by BellSouth, et cetera.

What we would propose to do is make BS-1 just the response and make BS-2 the table that was produced subsequently by BellSouth pursuant to that response. Because to be fair to BellSouth, they

didn't -- it was a subsequent production.

MR. COX: Okay. That table is different than the table currently listed as --

MR. TURKEN: No. It's the same table. It's just splitting BS-1 up into BS-1 and BS-2. If you think that's going to create more trouble than it's worth, then forget it.

MR. COX: What I'm trying to ask, I guess,
Mr. Turken, is BS-2 -- the table in BS-2, is that the
same table?

MR. TURKEN: No. I was going to add it -one more BS exhibit.

MR. COX: Okay. That will be fine.

MR. TURKEN: Okay. So I would propose, as I said, again, that we make new BS-2 the table that is currently listed as part of BS-1.

MR. COX: Okay.

MR. TURKEN: So BS-1 would be BellSouth's
Response to Access One's First Request for Production,
and BS-2 would be a table prepared by BellSouth in
response to Access One's First Request for Production,
which identifies all resale agreements entered into by
BellSouth that contain provisions similar to the TCCF
provision, except that the benefits under the
provision are unilateral to BellSouth.

1 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Any objections to the 2 change there in bifurcating those two? Okay. The record -- or the order will reflect that change. 3 4 Something else Access One? 5 MR. TURKEN: No. I believe -- I have a 6 question. We would obviously have to renumber the 7 subsequent BS-2, 3, 4. 8 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Sure. 9 MR. TURKEN: BS-3, 4 and 5. And this is a 10 question directed to Will Cox. Would you prefer us 11 also to include as part of the BS discovery -- the BS exhibits, BellSouth's response to Access One's Second 12 13 Request for Production? 14 MR. COX: We'd like to see all the 15 information that we can in this proceeding. It would 16 be up to you to offer it, but Staff would prefer to 17 see anything and everything that BellSouth has 18 provided to you. 19 MR. TURKEN: Okay. Then why don't we -- why 20 don't I propose that new BS-3 would be BellSouth's 21 response to Access One's Second Request for 22 Production.

Then new BS-4 would be a table prepared by BellSouth in response to Access One's Second Request for Production, which identifies all resale agreements

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1 entered into by BellSouth that contain a most Favored 2 Nations clause substantially similar to the clause 3 contained in the Access One agreement. Then what is currently identified as BS-3 4 5 would become BS-5, and what is currently identified as 6 BS-4 would become BS-6. 7 MR. COX: That would be fine with Staff. 8 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. The record 9 will reflect those changes. 10 MR. TURKEN: And Access One, I do not 11 believe, has further comments. 12 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Okay. BellSouth. 13 MR. CARVER: We have no changes to our 14 exhibit list. 15 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Very good. Proposed 16 stipulations, we'll have that added as it relates to 17 Issue 4. 18 Pending motions, I've addressed those. 19 Any other matters to come before me as 20 prehearing officer today? 21 MR. CARVER: None for BellSouth. MR. TURKEN: None for Access One. 22 23 MR. COX: None for Staff. 24 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: Staff. Thank you.

Hearing none then, thank you very much and this
