

The following is a supplement to Intelligence Network Online, Inc.'s application entitled "Authority To Provide Alternative Local Exchange Service Within the State of Florida". This supplement should be read in conjunction with the form, which form is incorporated herein by reference. Specifically, the following is in response to questions 18 A, B, and C contained on pages 6 and 7 of Form PSC/CMU 8 (11/95).

### **18.A. Financial Capability**

Attached hereto are the unaudited financial statements of Intelligence Network Online, Inc. for the fiscal years of 1996, 1997, and 1998. The provided financials consist of the Balance Sheets, Income Statements, and the Statements of Retained Earnings. The Statement of Retained Earnings is a line item contained on the Balance Sheet.

These unaudited financials were prepared by the Company's outside accountant, Martin J. Greenberg, CPA. Along with the financial statements, the Company provides Mr. Greenberg's accompanying compilation letters, dated June 14, 1999, for Intelligence Network Online's financials. These financials have been reviewed for accuracy by George R. Pilat, President/CEO, and Suzanna L. Pilat, Treasurer/CFO, of Intelligence Network Online, Inc. Both George R. Pilat and Suzanna L. Pilat have attested to the truth and correctness of the submitted financial statements of the Company.

#### Introduction and Company Overview

Applicant provides the following information regarding its history of operations. The information provided herein will assist the Commission in evaluating the Company's application as it creates an overview of Intelligence Network Online.

Intelligence Network Online (the "Company") was founded in August, 1993. The founders are the current management; there has been no management turnover. The Company was incorporated in Florida on February 17, 1994 and has remained active and in good standing since its incorporation. The Company was founded to

provide high speed Internet access in the Tampa Bay area. The Company initiated service April 1, 1994 and has continually provided service since then. Over the last five years, the Company has steadily grown its customer base while continually upgrading its technical capacity to remain a leader in high speed data transmission and Internet access.

 The Company currently has 2,000 customers representing 10,000 end users. The Company's customers include TECO, ValPak, and Tech Force.
 The Company currently offers data transmission through DS-3 Frame Relay Network, DS1 (while currently negotiating for a DS3 multiple connection to the Internet backbone), ADSL, ISDN, dial-up 56K (V.90), PVNs, Web hosting, and other related Internet and data transmission services.

### 18., A., 3., 1. - Written explanation that Intelligence Network Online has sufficient financial capability to provide the requested service.

The Company will initially be providing service in the six county Tampa Bay area serviced by GTE, this area's ILEC. The Company, with the assistance of its third party consultants, estimates that it will cost Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000) to deploy in this six county area and to continue providing service until a point of positive cash flow is reached. These monies will be raised through a combination of debt and equity financing. The Company's contracts for equipment, connectivity, and co-location will not be finalized until the requisite financing is obtained. The determination of the total monies required to provide service in this six county area is based on 1) the ongoing planning of the Company's management team since 1997, in particular the recent cost estimates obtained from equipment vendors and providers of connectivity and co-location space, 2) the Company's five years experience of providing services identical to those which it will initially offer as an authorized ALEC. 3) the experience and research of George A. Silver, a consultant to the Company who previously worked in the telecommunications industry for over 25 years, which experience is more fully described in subpart 18. B. below, 4) the research and information developed by the Company's consultant, Abbington Company, which experience is described more fully in subpart 18., B. below, and 5) the Company's careful review of the experiences of other ALEC's who have recently entered the market both in Florida and in other geographic areas.

### 18., A., 3. 2. - Written explanation that Intelligence Network Online has sufficient financial capability to maintain the requested service.

Please see the information provided directly above. From the Company's five years experience providing similar services, the Company is very familiar with the costs and expenses of maintaining such service, as well as being aware of the profit margins which are reasonably attainable. The Company and its consultants have put together a conservative business model and, therefore, are reasonably assured that the monies it will raise are sufficient to cover both deployment and ongoing operating expenses until a positive cash flow is attained. The Company's business model has been compared 1) to the business models of existing and operational ALECs, and 2) to both historic and future analysis of this segment of the telecommunications industry prepared by third party research and investment banking entities.

### 18., A., 3., 3. - Written explanation that Intelligence Network Online has sufficient financial capability to meet its lease or ownership obligations.

Please see the information provided in the two sections directly above. The Company has continuously operated for over five years and has never failed to meet its lease or ownership obligations, nor any other financial obligations. The management which has achieved this high level of financial responsibility will continue to be employed by the Company. Additionally, the Company has already retained consultants with experience in financial management of large public and private companies. The Company's business plan calls for the future retention of a CFO with both financial management and telecommunications industry experience.

The Company fully expects, based on its own past experience and the past experience of other ALECs/CLECs, to obtain favorable equipment leases and credit facilities which will directly address a major portion of its planned capital expenditures. The Company has already been contacted by a major equipment manufacturer with an expressed interest in working with Intelligence Network Online. The Company currently has up-to-date equipment with substantial unused capacity. The Company has obtained its equipment from leading telecommunications vendors and has established relationships with, among others, Sun Microsystems, Cisco Systems, Xylan, Sprint North Supply, Lucent Technologies and Digital Link.

### 18., B. - Managerial Capability - Resumes that indicate sufficient managerial experience.

The following provides information regarding the Company's key management personnel and the consultants currently assisting the Company in implementing its ALEC based business plan. In addition to the individuals described below, the Company recognizes that to expand its services in the Tampa Bay area as an ALEC, and thereafter to offer its services throughout Florida, will require the retention of substantial numbers of additional employees, including key management personnel. To this end, The Company has already begun to talk to persons with telecommunications industry experience who might fill key management positions.

#### George R. Pilat

Mr. Pilat is a founder of the Company and has been its President and CEO since its inception. In this capacity, Mr. Pilat has been responsible for defining the Company's vision and for constructing its operational structure. As noted above, the Company, under Mr. Pilat's direction, has been successful since its inception over 5 years ago. Before founding Intelligence Network Online, Mr. Pilat started and ran three other successful business ventures. Mr. Pilat studied Civil and Mechanical Engineering.

Mr. Pilat negotiated the Company's ongoing contracts with its backbone providers - GTE, AT&T, UUnet, Sprint, and Cable & Wireless. Mr. Pilat, along with Mr. Diveglia, negotiated the leases and/or purchase contracts for all of the Company's equipment.

Mr. Pilat has extensive experience with Unix, Sun Solaris, systems administration, and routers. Along with Mr. Diveglia, Mr. Pilat was responsible for conceiving, designing, and maintaining the Company's existing delivery system which includes the following equipment: Sun Solaris 2.7 operating environment on four Sun SPARC Center 2000E servers which internally runs on 12 Sun Micrsystems SPARC stations; 7513 Cisco router which is an advanced core router which allows the Company to fully utilize its multi-homed redundant Internet backbone connections simultaneously; a Xylan OmniSwitch which allows complete LAN switching coupled with powerful ATM switching, thereby integrates the Company's very powerful, comprehensive, flexible virtual LAN architecture; and other equipment for linking the Company's CSU/DSUs and Access Multiplexers.

Ms. Pilat has been on the Board of Directors of the Florida Internet Service Providers Association (FISPA) since its inception in May, 1996. FISPA was the first Internet service association in the country, and was the model for the national service providers association. As a Board member, Ms. Pilat has been active in defining and implementing quality standards and practices for ISPs and Internet related businesses.

Ms. Pilat is the Company's Webmaster and is proficient at designing Web sites for commercial clients. Ms. Pilat has been involved with Java development and applications; she also has experience with Unix, Sun Solaris, Adobe, Windows/DOS PPP applications and HTML/Web applications.

#### Gene L. Diveglia

Mr. Diveglia is the Company's Vice President and Chief Information Officer. Mr. Diveglia majored in Engineering Physics at Lehigh University, where he was also a technician and consultant to the Physics Department. Prior to joining the Company in 1993, Mr. Diveglia owned and operated a computer systems integration business. In this business, Mr. Diveglia worked extensively with Sun equipment and used Unix and C. Mr. Diveglia has been an Internet specialist since 1987.

Mr. Diveglia has technical experience and proficiency in both hardware and software applications, with strong experience in the following areas: Java design and implementation, Unix, Sun Solaris, C, C++, Object Oriented Technology, telecommunications technology, point to point TDM networks, TDM network diagnosis and repair, routed networks, enterprise routing protocols (BGP, OSPF, EIGRP, RIP), SONET frame-relay networks, ATM, fiber-optic systems and technology, database design and implementation, hardware troubleshooting and repair at the chip level, and software system design, prototyping and implementation.


