Unfortunately, I am returning my company's Florida Public Service Commission, "Telephone Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity". As of the date of this letter, my company shall no longer be responsible for fees, licenses, taxes or the recent "Service Violation Correction Form" your bureau sent me. Please remove our company information from your bimonthly mailings and newsletters. We have permanently removed and placed our one payphone out of service.

My company has operated a single pay telephone since 1994. It was used primarily by children at a regional family recreation and entertainment facility my company has operated for fifteen years. The demand for a payphone unit at my location remains strong, but your bureaucracy makes operating one impractical. Your "Service Violation Correction Form", along with the potential \$1,000 fine, set this letter in motion along with the cancellation of our telecommunication business certificate. How can your staff justify fining me when my payphone has been out of order since last December from a lightning bolt strike? I would like to repair my payphone, but the cost of a unionized AT & T repairman is \$135 for the first hour! My certificate is enclosed.

The bureaucracy that the Public Service Commission has evolved into needs to be evaluated from the bottom upwards. The paperwork and expenses involved in the acquisition and operation of a single payphone are ridiculous. Your over regulation has effectively removed small business owners from this industry. Does the Public Service Commission really believe we need all these rules and regulations for such a simple device as a payphone? It is my opinion that the Public Service Commission is a matured self serving bureaucracy whose main purpose is the monetary advancement of its directors and staff. It is time for the Public Service Commission to reevaluate their mission statement and truly implement "public service" and reasonable regulations to Florida small business payphone operators. Thank you.
