#### JEA'S RESPONSE TO LEAF'S FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES (NOS. 1-12)

1. Does the Company assign an availability factor to a power generation plant that is available during peak 50% of the time?

No, the JEA does not assign an availability factor to a power generation plant, as defined in this interrogatory, for the criteria "available during peak 50% of the time".

2. If the Company does assign an availability factor to a power generation plant that is available during peak 50% of the time, please specify that value and describe in detail how it is derived.

JEA does not assign this factor, therefore no answer is required for this question.

3. If the Company does not assign an availability factor to a power generation plant that is available during peak 50% of the time, please explain why not.

JEA assigns availability factors based on the percentage of time that a power generation plant is available over a period of one year, as availability factor is defined in this interrogatory.

4. If a power generation plant is available 50% of the time, does the company consider it dispatchable?

"Availability", as defined in this interrogatory as availability factor, and "dispatchable", as defined by industry standards, are independent criteria that are not directly related to one another. Therefore, this question can not be answered.

5. Does the Company calculate the capacity value of energy service facilities for resource planning purposes?

JEA assigns capacity values to its capacity resources and those values are used in the Ten Year Site Plan for resource planning purposes. The 1999 JEA Ten Year Site Plan is currently on file with the FPSC.

6. If the Company does not calculate the capacity value of energy service facilities for resource planning purposes, please explain why.

JEA does calculate the capacity value of energy service facilities, therefore, no answer is required for this question.

7. If the Company calculates the capacity value of energy service facilities for resource planning purposes, please state whether said calculation includes the effective load carrying capacity of solar and demand-side resources.

At this time, JEA has no solar resources, and therefore no solar resources are included as capacity. Demand-side resources are used in determining the JEA's total capacity available when determining the capacity requirements for the Ten Year Site Plan capacity resource planning study.

8. If the Company does include effective load carrying capacity of solar and demand-side management resource options in its calculation of the capacity value of its energy service facilities for resource planning purposes, please describe in detail how that inclusion occurs, including but not limited to a) which resources options are included; and b) how effective load carrying capacity is calculated.

Demand-side resources are included in the Ten Year Site Plan to the extent they are identified in JEA's current Demand-side Resource Plan, 1998 Annual Report, filed with the FPSC. The following is taken from the JEA's 1999 Ten Year Site Plan. "The demand-side management plan for JEA is instrumental in the determination of the overall least-cost resource plan. The demand-side management plan for JEA was approved by the FPSC on December 11, 1995, and continues to be integrated with supply options to evaluate overall resource plans."

9. If the Company does not include effective load carrying capacity in its calculation of capacity value of its energy service facilities for resource planning purposes, please explain.

JEA does include this in its capacity value, therefore, no answer is requires for this question.

10. Please state the lowest, the mean, and the highest price (in dollars per MW or dollars per MWH) the Company has paid for wholesale capacity and energy purchased other than pursuant to a contract with an Independent Power Producer under the Public Utility Regulatory Policy Act (PURPA) over the past three years.

## Energy

Low - \$8.00/MWH Mean - \$16.60/MWH High - \$3,000.00/MWH

## Capacity

Low - \$0.73/kW-mo Mean - Not Available High - \$21.75/kW-mo

NOTE: Capacity and Energy prices shown above are independent of each other and there is no relationship between the high and low energy and high and low capacity pricing. The high energy price was paid by JEA for energy purchased specifically for resale to another utility.
