After reviewing the application in the above referenced docket, the staff needs the additional information listed below. The letter is broken down into two parts, the Amendment Extension Application and the Deletion Application.

Amendment Extension Application

- 1. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(b), Florida Administrative Code (FAC), the utility must provide a statement showing the financial and technical ability of the utility to provide service and the need for service in the area. No statement was provided.
- 2. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(c), FAC, the utility must provide a statement that to the best of the applicant's knowledge the provision of service will be consistent with the water and wastewater sections of the local comprehensive plan at the time the application was filed, as approved by the Department of Community Affairs, or, if not, a statement demonstrating why granting the amendment would be in the public interest. No statement was provided.

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- 4. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(e), FAC, the utility must provide a description of the territory proposed to be served, using township, range and section references as specified in Rule 25-30.030(2). Although a description was provided, we are not able to map the description because of noncompliance of Rule 25-30.036(3)(i), FAC, and therefore are unable to determine if it is correct. In question 6 you are asked to map the description.
- 5. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(f), FAC, the utility must provide one copy of a detailed system map showing the proposed lines, treatment facilities, and the territory proposed to be served. The map shall be of sufficient scale and detail to enable correlation with the description of the territory. No system map was provided.
- 6. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(i), FAC, the utility must provide one copy of the official county tax assessment map or other map showing township, range and section, with a scale such as 1"=200' or 1"=400', with the proposed territory plotted thereon by use of metes and bounds or quarter sections, and with a defined reference point of beginning. We were not able to verify the description.
- 7. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(j), FAC, the utility must provide a statement describing the capacity of the existing lines, the capacity of the treatment facilities, and the design capacity of the proposed extension. No statement was provided.
- 8. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(k), FAC, the utility must provide the numbers and dates of any permits issued for the proposed system by the Department of Environmental Protection. This information was not provided.
- 9. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(1), FAC, the utility must provide a detailed statement regarding the proposed method of financing the construction and the projected impact on the utility's capital structure. No statement was provided.
- 10. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(m), FAC, the utility must provide a description of the types of customers anticipated to be served by the extension, i.e., single family homes, mobile homes, duplexes, golf course clubhouse, commercial, etc. No statement was provided.
- 11. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(n), FAC, the utility must provide a statement regarding the projected impact of the extension on the additional area. No statement was provided.
- 12. As required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(p), FAC, the utility must provide the applicant's current certificate. The certificate was not provided.

Deletion Application

Although the utility is intending to delete territory, the deletion application was not attached. Enclosed please find a copy of the application. Also listed are the requirements for that application.

- 1. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(b), FAC, the utility must provide a description of the territory to be deleted, using township, range, and section references.
- 2. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(c), FAC, the utility must provide one copy of a detailed system map showing the existing lines, treatment facilities, and territory served. The map shall be of sufficient scale and detail to enable correlation with the description of the territory.
- 3. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(d), FAC, the utility must the number of current active connections within the territory to be deleted.
- 4. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(e), FAC, the utility must provide one copy of the official county tax assessment map or other map showing township, range and section, with a scale such as 1"=200' or 1"=400', with the proposed territory plotted thereon by use of metes and bounds or quarter sections, and with a defined reference point of beginning.
- 5. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(f), FAC, the utility must provide a statement specifying the reasons for the proposed deletion of territory.
- 6. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(g), FAC, the utility must provide a statement indicating why the proposed deletion of territory is in the public interest.
- 7. As required by Rule 25-30.036(4)(h), FAC, the utility must provide a statement as to the effect of the proposed deletion on the ability of any customer or potential customer to receive water and wastewater service, including alternative source(s) of service.
- 8. As required by Section 367.045(1)(a), Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-30.030, FAC, the utility must provide notice of the application and provide affidavits that the notice was given. The notice must be given to the governmental entities and all utilities in the county, all cities located in the county, and to each of the customers in the deleted territory. The notice must be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area proposed to be served. A new County List is attached (Attachment A). - 9. As required by Section 367.045(2)(e), Florida Statutes a filing fee is required by Section 367.145, Florida Statutes. Please submit.
