Pursuant to Order No. PSC- 99-1397-PCO-TP, this Joint Prehearing Statement is filed on behalf of the following parties: Florida Competitive Carriers Association (FCCA); AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc. # D. <u>STATEMENT OF BASIC POSITION</u>:

The parties to this Joint Prehearing Statement urge the Commissioners to resolve Phase I on the basis of the following positions and to move expeditiously to Phase II of this proceeding.

# E. <u>STATEMENT OF ISSUES AND POSITIONS</u>:

# ISSUE 1: DEAVERAGING OF UNES

1(a) Which UNEs, excluding combinations, should be deaveraged?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

The above parties recommend the entry of an order requiring the large ILECs (BellSouth, GTE and Sprint) to file deaveraged cost studies for the local loop network element in Phase II. BellSouth, GTE, and Sprint should submit cost studies (recurring and non-recurring) for the following loop UNEs:

- 1. 2 wire analog loop
- 2. 4-wire analog loop
- 3. 2-wire ISDN/IDSL loop
- 4. 2-wire xDSL capable loop<sup>1</sup>
- 5. 4-wire xDSL capable loop!
- 6. DS-1 loop
- 7. 4-wire 56/64 kbps loop
- 8. DS-3
- 1(b) Which UNE combinations, if any, should be deaveraged?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Deaveraged cost studies (for both recurring and non-recurring costs) should be filed for the following specific combinations:

- 1) Loop, local switching (with signaling) and shared transport
- 2) Loop, DS0/1 multiplexing, DS1 interoffice transport
- 3) DS1 Loop, DS1 interoffice transport
- 4) DS1 loop, DS1/3 multiplexing, DS3 interoffice transport

If the Commission determines, at the conclusion of Phase II, to deaverage any other network elements, then the price of any combination that includes one or more of such deaveraged elements should be calculated to reflect the deaveraged cost of such element.

1(c) What is the appropriate basis for deaveraging UNEs?

The term xDSL-capable refers to a continuous facility that can support any xDSL technology without impediment, irrespective of the xDSL equipment choice of the CLEC. xDSL-capable loops should not be artificially limited by technology or distance.

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

UNEs should be deaveraged on the basis of TELRIC. Cost results should be provided by wire center. Once the cost studies have been submitted, proposals to develop specific zones should be presented by the parties to the Commission for evaluation.

1(d) Should the degree of deaveraging be uniform for all UNEs?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

The same set of zones should be used for all loop UNEs. Specific zone proposals should be considered in Phase II.

1(e) Should the degree of deaveraging be uniform for all affected ILECs for which deaveraged rates are appropriate?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

This issue should be decided in Phase II after actual cost data is available.

1(f) What other factors or policy considerations, if any, should be considered in determining deaveraged UNE rates?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Deaveraged UNE rates should be based only on costs and administrative convenience (i.e., it is appropriate to consider whether the cost to implement an additional zone is justified by the benefits of such deaveraging and the likely demand for a UNE in a particular zone). If an ILEC experiences effects from competition, existing Commission orders and Florida Statutes provide the ILEC the opportunity to petition for universal service relief (documented by actual, not speculative need) or propose a rate rebalancing.

1(g) What supporting data or documentation should an ILEC provide with its deaverage filing?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Each ILEC should make available its underlying cost study, in both hard copy and electronic form, with sufficient documentation of the model or models to permit parties to reproduce the ILEC's results and to perform sensitivity analyses. The ILEC shall also provide full documentation of all inputs and assumptions, including copies of all internal engineering guidelines relating to its network design assumptions. Cost studies will also provide references back to ILEC source documents to verify input assumptions and data. The ILEC should supply on request all such source documents, including vendor contracts. Proprietary data may be provided under a Commission-approved protective agreement.

# ISSUE 2: COMBINATIONS OF NETWORK ELEMENTS

2. How can one determine which UNEs an ILEC "currently combines" (51.315(b)), versus those which are not "ordinarily combined in the incumbent LEC's network" (51.315(c))?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Because of the legal uncertainty surrounding the status (and meaning) of Rule 51.315(c), the parties agree to address this issue in Phase II (if needed). The ILECs are required, however, to provide existing combinations of network elements to CLECs at TELRIC prices in accordance with 51.315(b) and the FCC's UNE pricing rules.

#### ISSUE 3: COST STUDIES

the second

3(a) What guidelines and specific requirements should be imposed on recurring and nonrecurring cost studies, if any, required to be filed in this proceeding?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Cost studies must comply with all effective federal rules codified in CFR § 51.501-511. Specific

guidelines include, but are not limited to, the following principles: The ILECs should assume the same network design for calculating both recurring and non-recurring costs. The network design should include an assumption that the ILECs have provided competitors with nondiscriminatory access to all operations support systems and associated databases. The network design should treat the existing ILEC wire center locations as fixed, but should assume that the ILECs deploy the least-cost, most efficient, forward-looking technology available to meet customer demand and that they deploy that technology in the most efficient manner possible, given existing and reasonably foreseeable demand. This would include an assumption of efficient utilization of plant, given the economic life of that plant and expected growth rates over that period.

3(b) For which UNEs should the ILECs submit cost studies sufficient to deaverage those UNEs identified in Issues 1(a) and 1(b)?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

The ILECs should submit deaveraged cost studies for the loop UNEs identified in Issue 1(a), as well as any combination that includes a loop UNE.

3(c) To the extent not included in Issue 3(b), should the ILECs be required to file recurring costs studies for any remaining UNEs, and combinations thereof, identified by the FCC in its forthcoming order on the Rule 51.319 remand?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

In addition to the deaveraged loop prices listed in 1(a), BellSouth, GTE, and Sprint should file revised cost studies (which are not required to be deaveraged) for the local switching network element, as well as:

DS0/1 multiplexing DS1/3 multiplexing DS3 Interoffice Transport

BellSouth, GTE, and Sprint should file cost studies for any new UNE adopted by the FCC in its remand decision and revised Rule 51.319.

3(d) To the extent not included in Issue 3(b), should the ILECs be required to file

nonrecurring cost studies for any remaining UNEs, and combinations thereof, identified by the FCC in its forthcoming order on the Rule 51.319 remand?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

ILECs should file non-recurring cost studies for each new element identified in 3(c), the loop UNEs listed in 1(a), as well as non-recurring cost studies for the combinations listed in 1(b).

3(e) When should the cost studies identified in Issues 3(b), (c), and (d) be filed?

Position of FCCA, Rhythms, AT&T, Covad, e.spire, FCTA, Florida Digital, Intermedia, MCI WorldCom, MediaOne, Northpoint, Supra, Time Warner Telecom, and KMC:

Cost studies should be filed within sixty (60) days from the conclusion of Phase I.
