## DIRECT TESTIMONY OF CHARLES R. GAUTHIER

- 2 Q. WHAT IS YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS?
- A. My name is Charles R. Gauthier, and my business address is 2555 Shumard Oak Boulevard. Tallahassee. Florida 32399-2100.
- 5 O. BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND WHAT IS YOUR POSITION?
- 6 A. I am employed by the Florida Department of Community Affairs (DCA) as
- 7 Chief of the Bureau of Local Planning. My responsibilities include the review
- 8 of comprehensive plans and developments of regional impact throughout the
- 9 state including Lake County. I supervise 47 professional planners.
- 10 Approximately 500 comprehensive plan amendment packages are reviewed each
- 11 | year.

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- 12 Q. HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN EMPLOYED WITH DCA?
- 13 | A. I was appointed Bureau Chief in March of 1999. From October 1994 to
- 14 March 1999, I served as Growth Management Administrator. During the 1980's.
- 15 I was employed by DCA for approximately two and one half years.
- 16 O. HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN EMPLOYED AS A PROFESSIONAL PLANNER?
- 17 A. I have been employed in the planning field since 1977 in the areas of
- 18 environmental regulation, comprehensive planning, development review and
- 19 growth management. A copy of my resume is attached as CRG-1.
- 20 | O. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY?
- 21 A. Pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Public Service
- 22 Commission (PSC) and DCA, my staff conducted an analysis of the application
- 23 by Florida Water Services Corporation (Florida Water) for an expansion of
- 24 territory, with respect to issues of concern for the DCA. The analysis was
- 25 provided via a cover letter dated April 15, 1999, from John E. Baker,

- 1 | Community Program Administrator, to Mr. Charles Hill, the former PSC Division
- 2 Director of the Water and Wastewater Bureau. The purpose of my testimony is
- 3 to authenticate the findings and the analysis contained in the April 2, 1999
- 4 supporting documentation to the April 15, 1999 cover letter, which are
- 5 attached as Exhibit CRG-2.
- 6 Q. WERE THE APRIL 2ND AND 15TH LETTERS PREPARED UNDER YOUR DIRECTION AND
- 7 | CONTROL?
- 8 A. Yes, they were prepared under my direction and control.
- 9 Q. COULD YOU PLEASE SUMMARIZE YOUR COMMENTS REGARDING FLORIDA WATER'S
- 10 APPLICATION?
- 11 A. The proposed amendment to the service territory of Florida Water is
- 12 consistent with the Lake County (County) comprehensive plan. The provision
- 13 of potable water services to this area will facilitate the development of the
- 14 area consistent with the County's plan and is not expected to contribute to
- 15 urban sprawl. DCA staff does not recommend any objections to the application.
- 16 Q. WOULD THIS RECOMMENDATION ALSO BE APPLICABLE FOR ANOTHER UTILITY
- 17 | REQUESTING TO SERVE IN THE SAME AREAS?
- 18 A. Yes, the same recommendation would apply regardless of who the service
- 19 provider might be.
- 20 Q. DOES THAT CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY?
- 21 A. Yes, it does.

### Summary

Florida Water Services Corporation has applied to the Public Service Commission to amend its current potable water service territory in Lake County, Florida. Florida Water Services currently provides potable water to an area in the northwestern part of Lake County and wishes to add an area to its territory which is currently served by its facilities but was inadvertently not filed for in previous years; to delete a small area of the territory which is currently served by Haines Creek Mobile Homesites Waterworks; and to request a territory expansion of approximately 1000 acres.

## Consistency with County's Comprehensive Plan

The proposed territory expansion is located between the Cities of Tavares (southeast) and Leesburg (southwest). The area is designated by the Lake County comprehensive plan as Urban (up to 7 du/ac) and Urban Expansion (up to 4 du/ac). The provision of the potable water services to this area is consistent with the county's plan and the densities assigned to area. Staff has contacted the Lake County planning staff and the County's staff is supportive of the proposed

amendment to the Florida Water Service Corporation service territory.

## Conclusion and Recommendation

The proposed amendment to the service territory of the Florida Water Service Corporation is consistent with the Lake County comprehensive plan. The provision of potable water services to this area will facilitate the development of the area consistent with the County's plan and is not expected to contribute to urban sprawl. Staff does not recommend any objections to the application.
