GTE FLORIDA INCORPORATED'S OPPOSITION TO MOTION OF THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC COUNSEL

On January 10, 2000, the Office of Public Counsel (OPC) filed a motion asking the Commission to designate as an issue in this proceeding "GTE's willful violation of the Commission's quality of service rules since January 1, 1996" (Motion). GTE Florida Incorporated (GTE) asks the Commission to deny OPC's Motion.

On December 21, 1999, the Commission issued an Order setting this docket for hearing. (Order No. PSC-99-2501-PCO-TL (Order).) That Order defines the basic parameters of this proceeding, setting forth matters to be investigated and the time period at issue. Specifically, the Commission will examine GTE's apparent failure to meet two service standards (Rule 25-4.070(3)(a), restoration of interrupted service; and Rule 25-4.066, installation of primary service) at various times since January 1, 1998. The Order also indicates that OPC "has initiated its own investigation" of GTE's service quality. (Order at 2.) During a meeting with Commission Staff, OPC, and GTE on October 13, 1999, it became clear that OPC's investigation is not congruent with the Commission's own inquiry in this docket. OPC's investigation reaches back to 1996 and concerns standards that are not a part of this docket.

The Commission, rather than OPC, has defined the relevant subject matter and period to be addressed in this show cause docket. The Commission's focus on particular service standards and its decision to examine GTE's compliance record for the past two

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years were based upon Staff's review of GTE's periodic service quality reports. (GTE believes these same temporal limits will apply to the ongoing service quality show cause dockets involving Sprint and BellSouth, respectively.)

Like the December 21 Order, GTE's settlement offer and the Staff's November 18, 1999 Recommendation to approve that offer explicitly reflect the 1998 date as the start of the period at issue in this docket. The Commission voted to go to hearing to explore GTE's compliance with specific standards during the specific period beginning with 1998. Before that vote was taken, OPC had the opportunity to argue its view as to the appropriate scope of the proceeding. It is too late now to change the basic parameters of the inquiry the Commission has launched. OPC's Motion should thus be denied.
