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COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you all very much. now we are on Docket 990721, is that correct? Are there any changes, Mr. Horton?

MR. HORTON: Commissioner, there is no changes to the prehearing order as it is, although there is some outstanding discovery due from the company to the staff. But, Commissioner, we are in a position at this time that I think we are going to have to ask for a continuance of that part of the hearing that involves us for a couple of reasons. Our goals were established, initial goals were established based on a percentage of goals that were set forth for JEA and Gulf Power in the initial conservation dockets. And our programs are similar to Gulf Power's, although they are not exactly the same. But they are very similar to that, based on them.

Our plan in this docket, as reflected in our testimony and meetings this summer with the staff was to continue the goals that had been approved for us in that, and that is how we have proceeded. Now, we have had some meetings with staff recently, we have also met with Gulf Power, and we are going to have to rely on Gulf Power to run some of the studies for us.

We met with them with respect to their approved goals, and their plan, and it is going to cause us to

reassess, refine some of that which we have already
submitted to the staff. We are going to need to revise
our goals and reevaluate where we are. I don't anticipate
that there is going to be disagreement or a problem based
on our meetings, it's just that we now find ourselves that
we are going to need some additional time to respond to
their discovery and update/revise our testimony.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, let me ask staff; what is the staff's position on that?

MR. KEATING: Staff wouldn't be opposed to the continuance. I don't think that that is going to cause us any heartburn. I was just discuss this with Tom. If we can work this out with these dockets where we can somehow get them to an agenda rather than the hearing date, perhaps that is one way we can handle this without the trouble of rescheduling on the calendar and finding a date that all the Commissioners are available.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, are you recommending that the continuance be granted?

MR. HORTON: Commissioner, let me interject here. My client was supposed to be here this morning, unfortunately he was flying through Atlanta last night. So let me talk with him if I could. If at all possible we would like to get all the information to staff and use that date that you have already got. But in an abundance

of caution, I really have got less than a 50/50 1 expectation that is going to happen given the information 2 3 I received the other day? COMMISSIONER CLARK: So you don't want to 4 continue the hearing at this point? 5 MR. HORTON: If I can get the information to 6 staff in time, then we could use that. I doubt that is 7 going to happen, but I will know today just exactly how 8 much time we are going to need. 9 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Well, then we are 10 apprised of the fact that you might ask for a continuance 11 and we will handle it when it arrives. 12 That would be fine. I just wanted 13 MR. HORTON: to let you know, and we will do everything we can, but I 14 don't think it is going to happen. 15 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. 16 MR. KEATING: And that would be fine with staff. 17 We will keep working with Florida Public Utilities and see 18 if we can get this done as soon as possible. 19 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. That sounds 20 But, in the meantime, Mr. Horton, is there anything 21 that needs to be changed in the draft prehearing order? 22 MR. HORTON: No, ma'am. 23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Mr. Young, did you 24 25 want to add anything?
