Collect Billing - A billing arrangement whereby the originating caller may bill the charges for a call to the called party, provided the called party agrees to accept the charges.

Commission - The Florida Public Service Commission.

Company or Carrier - Global Crossing North American Networks, Inc. (T) unless otherwise clearly indicated by the context.

Customer - The person, firm, corporation, or other entity which orders and establishes service with the Company, either for its own use or for purposes of resale; and who accesses the Company's network via presubscription, dedicated access, travel and debit card services, or by dialing the Company's 10XXX or 101XXXX, 950, 700 or 500 access codes; and who is responsible for the payment of charges and for compliance with the Company's tariffs. "Customer" shall also include a person, firm, corporation or other entity that has not established an account with the Company but 1) accesses and uses the Company's network for telecommunications services via an access code belonging to the Company or any of its affiliates or subsidiaries; 2) places an operator service call from a telephone made available to transient users and presubscribed to the Company, or accepts charges for a collect or third party call carried by the Company; or 3) otherwise accesses the Company's network and receives services for which no other Customer is obligated to compensate the Company.

Customer Dialed Calling Card Call - A service whereby the End User dials all of the digits necessary to route and bill the call to a valid non-Global Crossing calling card or credit card.

Day Rate Period - After 8:00 am to, but not including, 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

Dedicated Access - See Special Access.

End User - See Customer.

Equal Access - The ability of the Carrier to serve End Users on a presubscribed basis rather than through the use of dial access codes.

Evening Rate Period - After 5:00 pm to, but not including, 11:00 pm Monday through Friday, and on Sunday.

FPSC - The Florida Public Service Commission.

Global Crossing - Used throughout this tariff to mean Global $^{\rm (T)}$ Crossing North American Networks, Inc. unless clearly indicated $^{\rm (T)}$ otherwise by the text.

Holidays - Holidays observed by the Carrier as specified in this tariff.

LATA - Local access and transport area. A geographic area established by the US District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 17-49, within which a local exchange company provides communications services.

LEC - Local Exchange Company

Night/Weekend Rate Period - After 11:00 pm to, but not including, 8:00 am Monday through Friday, all day Saturday, and Sunday to, but not including 5:00 pm.

Operator Dialed Surcharge - This charge applies to calls when the user dials "00" only or any valid company operator access code and requests that the operator dial the destination number.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS

2.1 Undertaking of Global Crossing

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Global Crossing is a resale common carrier providing (T) intrastate telecommunications services within the State of Florida.

Service is provided twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days a week.

2.2 Applicability of Tariff

This tariff is applicable to telecommunications services provided by Global Crossing North American Networks, Inc. (T) within the state of Florida.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

2.6 Minimum Service Period

The minimum service period is one month (30 days).

2.7 Cancellation by Customer

Unless otherwise specified elsewhere in this tariff or by mutually accepted contract between the Customer and the Company, service may be canceled by the Subscriber or Customer on not less than 30 days prior written notice to the Company.

2.8 Refusal or Discontinuance by Company

- 2.8.1 Service may be suspended by the Company, without notice to the Customer, by blocking traffic to certain cities or NXX exchanges, or by blocking calls using certain Customer travel cards when the Company deems it necessary to take such action to prevent unlawful use of its service. Global (T Crossing will restore services as soon as it can be provided without undue risk, and will upon request by the Customer, assign new travel card codes to replace ones that have been deactivated.
- 2.8.2 Global Crossing may refuse or discontinue service (T) under the following conditions provided that, unless otherwise stated, the Customer shall be given 15 days notice to comply with any rule or remedy any deficiency:
 - (A) For non-compliance with or violation of any State, municipal, or Federal law, ordinance or regulation pertaining to telephone service.
 - (B) For use of telephone service for any purpose other than that described in the application.
 - (C) For neglect or refusal to provide reasonable access to Global Crossing or its agents for (T) the purpose of inspection and maintenance of equipment owned by Global Crossing or its (T) agents.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

2.8 Refusal or Discontinuance by Company, (Cont'd)

- (D) For noncompliance with or violation of Commission regulation or Global Crossing's (T rules and regulations on file with the Commission, provided five (5) working days' written notice is given before termination.
- (E) For nonpayment of bills, provided that suspension or termination of service shall not be made without five (5) days written notice to the Customer, except in extreme cases. Such notice will be provided in a mailing separate from the customer's regular monthly bill for service.
- (F) Without notice in the event of Customer or Authorized User use of equipment in such a manner as to adversely affect Global (T) Crossing's equipment or service to others. (T)
- (G) Without notice in the event of tampering with the equipment or services owned by Global (T) Crossing or its agents. (T)
- (H) Without notice in the event of unauthorized or fraudulent use of service. Whenever service is discontinued for fraudulent use of service, Global Crossing may, before restoring service, (T) require the Customer to make, at his or her own expense, all changes in facilities or equipment necessary to eliminate illegal use and to pay an amount reasonably estimated as the loss in revenues resulting from such fraudulent use.
- (I) Without notice by reason of any order or decision of a court or other government authority having jurisdiction which prohibits Company from furnishing such services.
- (J) For periods of inactivity over sixty (60) days.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

2.9 Limitations of Service

- 2.9.1 Service will be furnished subject to the availability of the necessary facilities and/or equipment and subject to the provisions of this tariff.
- 2.9.2 Global Crossing reserves the right to discontinue (furnishing service, upon written notice, when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the Customer is using the service in violation of the provisions of this tariff, or in violation of law.
- 2.9.3 The Company does not undertake to transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities when available, and will not be liable for errors in transmission or for failure to establish connections.
- 2.9.4 Global Crossing reserves the right to discontinue the offering of service or deny an application for service if a change in regulation materially and negatively impacts the financial viability of the service in the best business judgment of the Company.

2.10 Use of Service

Service may be used for any lawful purpose for which it is technically suited. Customers or Subscribers reselling or rebilling Global Crossing's Florida intrastate service must have a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity as an interexchange carrier from the Florida Public Service Commission.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

2.14 Cost of Collection and Repair

Customer is responsible for any and all costs incurred in the collection of monies due the Company including legal and accounting expenses. The Customer or the Subscriber is also responsible for recovery costs of Company-provided equipment and any expenses required for repair or replacement of damaged equipment.

2.15 Tests, Pilots, Promotional Campaigns and Contests

The Company may conduct special tests or pilot programs and promotions at its discretion to demonstrate the ease of use, quality of service and to promote the sale of its services. The Company may also waive a portion or all processing fees or installation fees for winner of contests and other occasional promotional events sponsored or endorsed by the Company. From time to time the Company may waive all processing fees for a Customer.

These promotions will be approved by the FPSC with specific starting and ending dates with promotions running under no circumstances longer than 90 days in any twelve month period.

2.16 Other Rules

- Global Crossing reserves the right to validate the (T) 2.16.1 credit worthiness of Customers or Authorized Users through available verification procedures. Where a travel card code cannot be validated, the Customer or Authorized User may be required to provide an acceptable alternate billing method or the Carrier may refuse to place the call.
- The Company reserves the right to discontinue 2.16.2 service, limit service, or to impose requirements on Subscribers or Customers as required to meet changing regulations, rules or standards of the FPSC.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

2.17 Special Conditions Applicable to Operator Services

- 2.17.1 Subscribers must place a notice on or near each instrument that provides transient access to Global Crossing's operator services. The notice will be provided by Global Crossing North American Networks, Inc. unless contractual agreement transfers the requirement to the call aggregator (as is frequently the case for LEC-provided public or semi-public service.) In all cases the notice will include the following information, customized for the individual installation:
 - (A) InterLATA operator service is provided by Global Crossing. (T)
 - (B) Per Call Service Charges: [as per product description and rate described elsewhere in this tariff]
 - (C) Calls may be billed to most telephone company calling cards or to major credit cards such as MasterCard or American Express.
 - (D) Please consult the local telephone company directory or local telephone company operator for intraLATA dialing instructions and rates.
 - (E) To place an interLATA call dial [access code where applicable] + 0 + area code + interLATA telephone number.
 - (F) The establishment surcharge for Local Calls is: \$X.XX/X% (to be billed by establishment).
 - (G) The establishment surcharge for Long Distance Calls is: \$X.XX/X% (to be billed by establishment).
 - (H) Global Crossing's interLATA rates may be (T) obtained by dialing [the toll free number provided by Global Crossing]. (T)

When the premises equipment functions differently than stated above, the tent card or sticker will be modified to reflect the actual dialing pattern.

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SECTION 2.0 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (Cont'd)

- 2.17 Special Conditions Applicable to Operator Services, (cont'd.)
 - 2.17.2 Any applicable surcharges billed at check out time by a hotel/motel Subscriber for local or long distance calls must also be stated on the tent card. Subscriber surcharges will not be billed on telephone bills by Global Crossing.
 - So long as Florida Rules require, IntraLATA "0+" 2.17.3 calls and all "0-" (zero minus) calls will be routed to the local exchange carrier. Where the capability exists, the local exchange carrier will route 0- interLATA calls to the presubscribed carrier of the access line. In all other cases the local carrier will route 0- interLATA calls as determined by applicable state and federal laws.
 - 2.17.4 Calls handled and billed by Global Crossing. will be audibly and distinctly branded "Global Crossing Tele-services" at the beginning and end of the operator treatment portion of the call and prior to the commencement of billing. Callers may disconnect from the call after the brand and prior to connection without incurring any call charges.
 - 2.17.5 The Company shall provide an opportunity for each caller to be identified by name to the called party before any collect calls may be completed.

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SECTION 3.0 - DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE, (Cont'd)

3.7 Switched Message Service

3.7.1 General Description

Switched Message Service offers Customers the use of the communications facilities shared among multiple users. When a Switched Message Service call is established in one time-of-day rate period and ends in another, the rate in effect during each rate period is applied to the portion of the total call occurring during that rate period.

3.7.2 Frontrunner Service

Frontrunner Service is a multipoint, switched service allowing Subscribers to originate calls via local telephone access lines, including Equal Access lines which are presubscribed to the Carrier. All calls are rounded to the next higher full minute. Per minute usage charges apply to each call. Volume discounts apply. Subscribers will automatically receive increased volume discounts as their monthly usage increases. All calls will be rated at the appropriately discounted Per Minute Usage Charge for the usage tier achieved. Discounts do not apply to Directory Assistance or Operator Assisted calls. No other volume discounts will be applied to this service. Frontrunner Subscribers will receive a retroactive discount on all calls to their most frequently called area code in each billing period where their total usage exceeds the specified amount. OMNI Card Option allows all Frontrunner Subscribers to originate calls via a Carrier-provided 800 number. All OMNI Card Option calls are rounded to the next higher full minute. Intrastate and interstate Frontrunner and OMNI Card Option usage and international usage will be combined for purposes of applying discounts. Discounts will also be applied to all OMNI Card Option Usage. Frontrunner and Frontrunner OMNI Card Subscribers, who are Global Crossing VISA Card holders in good standing will receive annually a retroactive discount on all usage up to the Maximum Discount amount.

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SECTION 4.0 - RATES

4.1 General

Each Customer is charged individually for each call placed through the Company. Charges are computed on an airline mileage basis as described in Section 3.2 of this tariff.

Charges may vary by service offering, mileage band, class of call, time of day, day of week and/or call duration.

Customers are billed based on their use of Global Crossing's (T) long distance service. No installation charges or fixed monthly recurring charges apply.

Example of calculation of volume discounts:

Monthly Simplicity Usage: Interstate \$33.42 Florida \$21.94 ¹ International \$18.17

Total Usage \$73.53

Volume Discount 5% - 3.68

Area Code Discount - 1.82

Total due (before tax) \$68.03

Includes calls to 305 area code totaling \$18.20, the caller's most frequently called area code.

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SECTION 4.0 - RATES, (Cont'd)

4.2 Exemptions and Special Rates

4.2.1 Discounts for Hearing Impaired Customers

A telephone toll message which is communicated using a telecommunications devise for the deaf (TDD) by properly certified hearing or speech impaired persons or properly certified business establishments or individuals equipped with TDDs for communicating with hearing or speech impaired persons will receive, upon request, credit on charges for certain intrastate toll calls placed between TDDs. The credit to be given on a subsequent bill for such calls placed between TDDs will be equal to applying the off-day rate during business day hours. Discounts do not apply to per call add-on charges for services when the call is placed by a method that would normally incur the surcharge.

4.2.2 Emergency Call Exemptions

The following calls are exempted from all charges: Emergency calls to recognizable authorized civil agencies including police, fire, ambulance, bomb squad and poison control. Global Crossing will only handle these calls if the caller dials all of the digits to route and bill the call. Credit will be given for any billed charges pursuant to this exemption on a subsequent bill after verified notification by the billed Customer within thirty (30) days of billing.

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4.2.3 Operator Assistance for Handicapped Persons

Operator station surcharges will be waived for operator assistance to a caller who identified him or herself as being handicapped and unable to dial the call because of the handicap.

Operator Services, (Cont'd)

Pay Telephone Option 4.9.3

So long as the rules of the FPSC allow, Global Crossing offers an optional plan to private pay telephone service providers whereby the applicable end user rates are those contained in sections 4.9.1 and 4.9.2. In addition, the pay telephone service provider may include an optional surcharge of up to \$0.25.
