## NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER OF CONTROL

## BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, provides that a person may not acquire ownership or control of any telecommunications facility, or any extension thereof for the purpose of providing telecommunications services to the public, including the acquisition, transfer, or assignment of majority organizational control or controlling stock ownership, without prior approval from this Commission.

On December 20, 1999, Robert E. Mocas (Mr. Mocas) and Teligent, Inc. (Teligent) filed with this Commission an application for approval of transfer of control of Easton Telecom Services, Inc. (Easton Telecom) from Mr. Mocas to Teligent. Easton Telecom

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is the holder of Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 3989 and Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 5187. Easton Telecom has stated that the transaction will be virtually transparent to its customers in Florida and it will not affect the services being provided. Easton Telecom has further stated that it will continue to operate under its existing certificated name and tariff on file with this Commission.

In accordance with our authority under Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, to approve the acquisition or transfer of majority organizational control or controlling stock ownership of a telecommunications company providing service in Florida, we have reviewed the Petition of Mr. Mocas and Teligent, and find it appropriate to approve it. We have based our review and decision upon an analysis of the public's interest in efficient, reliable Our decision does not address the telecommunications service. potential impact of the transfer on the competitive market in Florida, or on the companies' or their competitors' interests. emphasize, however, that our approval of the Petition pursuant to our authority under Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, does not preclude us from addressing any of our concerns that may arise regarding this transaction to the appropriate federal or state agencies.

Based on the foregoing, it is,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Robert E. Mocas and Teligent, Inc.'s request for approval of transfer of control of Easton Telecom Services, Inc. from Robert E. Mocas to Teligent, Inc. is hereby approved. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this Docket shall be closed.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
