Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter confirms that Progress Telecommunications Corporation ("PTC") has an intercompany line of credit with Progress Capital Holdings Inc.("PCH"), its parent company and the wholly owned downstream holding company for all of Florida Progress Corporation's diversified operations. Borrowings by PTC under its inter-company line of credit are funded externally through PCH's \$400 million commercial paper program which is rated A-1 by Standard & Poor's and P-1 by Moody's. The commercial paper program is backed by a \$100 million 364day and \$300 million long-term revolving credit facility with a group of banks led by Chase Manhattan. These facilities expire in November 2000 and November 2003, respectively.

In addition to the inter-company line of credit, PCH has a \$41 million equity investment in PTC. PTC also has access to long-term financing through the PCH medium-term note program.


