This will also respond to your invitation to submit suggestions on procedure for this proceeding.

Odyssey's paramount concern remains the preservation of the confidentiality of its trade secrets and other proprietary business information submitted in good faith pursuant to Tampa Electric's Commission-approved CISR tariff. We believe that a decision on Allied/CFI's demand for discovery of such materials is simply not ripe at this time. Instead, we suggest that Staff complete its review of Tampa Electric's March 10, 2000 analysis (Documents 03139-00 through 03143-00) and formulate a recommendation for Commission action on the merits thereon in a manner that preserves the confidentiality. The Commission's decision should be issued as proposed agency action.

If there is a valid protest to the PAA, we suggest that in camera discovery
proceedings be conducted to enable a careful and appropriate balancing of
Odyssey's trade secret privilege and Allied/CFI's due process rights. We
believe that counsel for all parties should be given an opportunity to
participate at such in camera proceedings, subject to limitations and
procedures to ensure that disclosure of privileged matters would be strictly
prohibited. We believe it would be appropriate to convene such in camera DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

proceedings before an Administrative Law Judge from the Division of Administrative Hearings.
