Issue 2: Should Lake Josephine be ordered to show cause, in writing within 21 days, why it should not be fined up to \$5,000 per day for failure to maintain its accounts and records in conformance with the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) Uniform System of Accounts (USOA), in apparent violation of Rule 25-30.115(1), Florida Administrative Code and Order No. PSC-95-1044-FOF-WU?

Recommendation: No. Lake Josephine should not be ordered to show cause, in writing within 21 days, why it should not be fined up to \$5,000 per day for failure to maintain its accounts and records in conformance with the NARUC USOA, in apparent violation of Rule 25-30.115(1), Florida Administrative Code and Order No. PSC-95-1044-FOF-WU.

Issue 4: Should the transfer of facilities and Water Certificate 424-W from Lake Josephine Water to AquaSource Utility, Inc. be approved?

Recommendation: Yes. The transfer of facilities and Water Certificate 424-W from Lake Josephine to AquaSource Utility, Inc. should be approved. Further, AquaSource should be required to file an amendment of territory application within 60 days of the effective date of the order. Also, AquaSource should be responsible for the filing of the 1999 annual report and the payment of the 1999 regulatory assessment fees.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. AquaSource should continue charging the rates and charges approved for Lake Josephine. The tariff should be effective for services rendered or connections made on or after the stamped approval date, in accordance with Rule 25-30.475, Florida Administrative Code.

<u>Issue 8</u>: Should this docket be closed?

<u>Recommendation</u>: No. This docket should remain open to allow AquaSource to file an application for an amendment within 60 days of the effective date of the order. If no timely protest is received to the proposed agency action issues upon expiration of the protest period, the order should become final and effective upon issuance of a Consummating Order.
