ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING NOTICE OF DISMISSAL

BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 27, 1999, AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc. d/b/a Connect 'N Save and d/b/a Lucky Dog and d/b/a ACC Business (AT&T) filed a complaint against BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth) regarding improper application of switched access charges. On September 16, 1999, BellSouth filed its Answer and Response to the Complaint. The matter was set for administrative hearing. On December 16, 1999, Order No. PSC-99-2465-PCO-TP was issued establishing procedures and the case proceeded toward hearing. On April 14, 2000, BellSouth filed a Motion to Amend its Pre-hearing Statement.

On April 20, 2000, the hearing was convened at which time the parties informed the Commissioners that settlement was reached and a Notice of Withdrawal would be filed when the settlement documents were final. The hearing was continued pending further notice from the parties. On June 1, 2000, AT&T filed a Notice of Dismissal of its Complaint against BellSouth stating that a settlement of all disputed issues was reached in a mutually satisfactory manner.


Based on the foregoing, it is

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
