## ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL

BY THE COMMISSION:

eData.com sought a declaratory statement from the Commission, which it later voluntarily withdrew on August 14, 2000. The law is clear that the plaintiff's right to take a voluntary dismissal is absolute. <u>Fears v. Lunsford</u>, 314 So. 2d 578, 579 (Fla. 1975). It is also established civil law that once a timely voluntary dismissal is taken, the trial court loses its jurisdiction to act and cannot revive the original action for any reason. <u>Randle-Eastern Ambulance Service, Inc. v. Vasta</u>, 360 So. 2d 68, 69 (Fla. 1978).

Accordingly, we find that eData.com's voluntary dismissal of its petition for declaratory statement divests us of further jurisdiction over this matter. We therefore acknowledge eData.com's voluntary dismissal without prejudice and close the docket.

It is therefore

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that this docket shall be closed.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
