RESPONSE OF OCALA SPRINGS UTILITIES INC., TO STAFF'S FIRST DATA REQUEST

AND

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE INFORMATION PURSUANT TO ORDER NOS. PSC-98-1644-FOF-WS AND PSC-98-1374-PCO-WS

Ocala Springs Utilities Inc. ("OSUI"), by and through its undersigned attorneys, hereby responds to Staff's First Data Request, dated August 10, 2000, and requests a 12 month extension of time in which to file with the Florida Public Service Commission the information required pursuant to Order Nos. PSC-98-1374-PCO and PSC-98-1644-FOF in the above-stated docket, and as grounds states:

1. OSUI is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Avatar Utilities Inc. ("AUI"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Avatar Holdings Inc. ("AHI"). OSUI was established by AUI for the specific purpose of providing water and wastewater service to an undeveloped tract of acreage known as Ocala Springs, to be developed as an active adult community. The entire tract of 4,666 acres is owned by Avatar Properties Inc. ("API"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of AHI. The history of master land use planning of Ocala Springs, and API's vested development rights, including binding letters of interpretation issued by the Florida Department of Community Affairs, are attached as Attachment 1, Exh. B, to OSUI's application for original certificate, filed with the PSC on July 13, 1998.

Pursuant to Order No. PSC-98-1374-PCO, issued October 2. 12, 1998 in this docket, OSUI was granted a temporary variance from or temporary waiver of Rules 25-30.033(1)(h), (j), (k), (m), (o), (r), (t), (u), (v), (w)(2), (3), and (4), and 25-30.433(10). This temporary variance was granted on the basis that the development plans for Ocala Springs are predicated on the assurances and economic feasibility of water and wastewater service which can only be achieved through the creation of a utility entity and the construction of the required water and wastewater infrastructure to service the development. Order No. PSC-98-1374-PCO-WS stated that OSUI faced the technical hardship of needing the water and wastewater certificates in order to proceed with the development plans for Ocala Springs, and initial rates and charges for the utility cannot be established until the development plans are complete.

3. Pursuant to Order No. PSC-98-1644-FOF-WS, issued December 7, 1998 in this docket, OSUI was granted Certificate Nos. 604-W and 520-S. Order No. PSC-98-1644-FOF-WS ordered

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that, pursuant to Order No. PSC-98-1374-PCO-WS, OSUI was required to submit a separate application, within this docket, by December 7, 2000, to establish initial rates and charges, and was required to submit detailed system maps and evidence of ownership of plant sites when it submits its applications for permits with the Water Management District and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. At the time of filing its amended petition for temporary variance or temporary wavier, OSUI anticipated that application for consumptive use permit and application for wastewater system construction permits was scheduled to occur by July 1, 1999, and utility construction would commence by January 1, 2000. This docket was held open pending the completion of the filing requirements and the establishment of rates and charges.

4. Development of Ocala Springs is still predicated upon provision of water and wastewater utility service by OSUI. However, the Ocala Springs active adult community development planning process has been delayed in order for AHI to complete development of a similar active adult community in Polk County. There are no known regulatory or other impediments to the Ocala Springs development. In one year's time, AHI believes that it will know development plans for Ocala Springs, and therefore, the time schedule for utility filings as required by the orders issued in this docket.

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WHEREFORE, OSUI respectfully requests that the Commission grant OSUI:

1. A 12 month extension of time in which to file the information required by Order Nos. PSC-98-1374-PCO-WS and PSC-98-1644-FOF-WS, as set forth therein, that is, until December 7, 2001, and

2. Any such other relief as is appropriate.
